## Anointing of the Sick

*The Rite of Anointing tells us there is **no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament.***

*A careful judgment about the serious nature of the illness is sufficient.*



*When the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is given, the hoped-for effect is that, if it be God's will, the person be physically healed of illness. But even if there is no physical healing, the primary effect of the Sacrament is a spiritual healing by which the sick person receives the Holy Spirit's gift of peace and courage to deal with the difficulties that accompany serious illness or the frailty of old age.*


## *Reflection*

The goal of Parish Social Ministry is to engage parishioners in social justice and outreach activities that allow us to live out the Gospel call to serve others and to build the Kingdom of God. Clare House is a community space where we exchange resources, offer assistance, and build relationships.

The Outreach Ministry at Clare House offers direct service to community members facing difficulties of all kinds. We strive to build authentic relationships with every individual who walks through the door and commit to journey in solidarity with them. We offer assistance to alleviate immediate needs. Clients receive access to: food pantry, thrift shop, case management, advocacy, information and referral, and other resources.

The Social Justice Ministry at Clare House works to expand our understanding and application of Catholic Social Justice through the use of praxis. We employ the "See, Judge, Act" Method to examine pressing social problems. By utilizing education, advocacy, and community organizing we put our faith in action to address structural issues and eliminate systemic injustice. We feed the hungry and ask why they are hungry. The Social Justice Committee meets first Thursdays at 7pm in Clare House. ALL ARE WELCOME!

## Finding God in the Wilderness

Sunday, September 3, 2017

Week One: God's Boundless Love

As we reflect on the readings from today's Mass, we seek to understand them through the lens of God's creation. We call upon the Holy Spirit to fill our hearts and help us to hear God's voice in these words.

### Examination

My soul is thirsting for you, O Lord my God. O God, you are my God whom I seek; for you my flesh pines and my soul thirsts like the earth, parched, lifeless and without water.

My soul is thirsting for you, O Lord my God.

God loves us boundlessly and deeply. We are made for God's love—we thirst for it with the same intensity that we thirst for water. God created the natural world out of this immense love as a gift to us. Water is a symbol of God's love: pure, perfect, and life-sustaining.

Do not conform yourselves to this age but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and pleasing and perfect.

We live in an age in which we misuse God's gift of creation out of greed and indifference. Now in the Southwest United States, rising temperatures have led to parched and lifeless earth. Plants wither and people suffer. This is one of many ways in which lack of concern for the environment translates to pain for our brothers and sisters.

We must not continue to conform to this age of greed and wastefulness. Rather, let us be transformed. God calls us to conversion—a "renewal of our minds." We are called to open ourselves up to the contemplation of God's gift of creation, to recognize the depth of God's love for us, and to listen and respond to the cry of creation and the poor.

### Gratitude/Contrition

As we look back on this past week, we allow the Holy Spirit to guide us through our memories and emotions. We remember the moments when we glimpsed God's beauty and power in creation. We give thanks for

the times when we were able to serve God by caring for creation, and we offer our sincere contrition for the times when we failed to do so.

- ◇ Where was I most aware of God's beauty in creation last week?
- ◇ How did I make a conscious effort to care for God's creation last week?
- ◇ What challenges or joys do I experience as I recall my care for creation?
- ◇ How can I repair breaks in my relationship with creation?

### Hope

In *Laudato Si*, Pope Francis reminds us: "All it takes is one good person to restore hope!" (LS 71) How will you be that one good person this week?

Suggestions: Make a conscious effort to take shorter showers or donate to help victims of drought.

## "But who do you say that I am?"

In today's gospel reading, we find Jesus asking his disciples about the perceptions others have of him. He does not, however, stay on the topic of public opinion for long. Jesus quickly moves to a much more intimate and personal question for the disciples: "But who do you say that I am?" Jesus provides us with an opportunity to reflect upon how we would

answer that question today.

In two or three paragraphs, how would you answer Jesus' question?

This was, in fact, my first assignment as a theology student in a Christology class at Boston College some 23 years ago. The professor gave us time to write and then the opportunity to introduce ourselves to our fellow students. I was impressed that there were students from all over the world – U.S., Pakistan, India, Kenya, Rwanda, Mexico – and remember being struck by how students from developing countries often highlighted Jesus' connection with the poor.

The following summer, I had a class with Jon Sobrino, S.J., the Jesuit theologian who teaches at the Central American University (UCA) and whose companions were murdered at the UCA in 1989 because of their commitments to working for justice and peace in El Salvador. Sobrino developed his Christology from his lived experiences with the suffering poor of El Salvador – the "crucified peoples" of history. In class, Sobrino introduced us to a different face of Christ. Rather than an abstract person who identifies with the powerful and passively accepts unjust suffering, Sobrino described how the poor in El Salvador viewed Christ as "the Liberator." Sobrino taught me that where and with whom we stand makes a difference when it comes to doing theology.

One of my former students, Jesse Sullivan, gave a talk a few years ago while he was studying in Stanford's MBA program. Charged with the task of sharing his "one life changing idea" with professors and students, he spoke about choosing life over luxury. Jesse challenged his academic community to turn statistics of people living in poverty into our brothers and sisters by traveling to the developing world and creating a loving relationship with someone in extreme poverty.

Certainly, not everyone has the opportunity to travel to a developing country. I do believe, however, that friendship with the poor and excluded, even in our own communities, will influence our answer to Jesus' question. It certainly did for Jesse Sullivan and Jon Sobrino, S.J.

## *PARISH CENTER LOWER LEVEL (PATRICIA DESMOND HALL) CLOSED FOR REPAIRS*

Just as our homes and apartments sometimes give us emergency repair woes, apparently the parish buildings are also susceptible to unexpected problems. We recently discovered that our Parish Center Lower Level, also known as Patricia Desmond Hall, has not one, but two cracks in the foundation that must be immediately repaired to prevent further water damage.

The diocese has been notified as we will be going through the insurance company (which includes a \$5,000 deductible which we must pay) and contractors have been on site to assess the scope of the project and do some preliminary work. The contractors will need to excavate to get to the outside foundation wall and then make all necessary repairs on the exterior and interior. To our dismay, the exterior work will not be covered and we do not yet know how much it will cost us.



As a result, to ensure everyone's safety, we have closed the entire lower level of the parish center until the work is completed. All ministries, groups and programs which normally meet in the space have been temporarily relocated to other parts of the parish center. We ask for your prayers and your patience as the work gets underway and we will keep you updated on our progress.



## *Happy 10th Anniversary to the Prayer Shawl Ministry*

On the evening of *September 6th, 2007*, twelve enthusiastic women met to brainstorm and share creative ideas on what would become the Prayer Shawl Ministry. Then, on Wednesday, October 3rd, 2007, they met to knit, crochet and pray. The group has grown in numbers and continues to meet the first Wednesday of every month at 10:30am. Ironically, their next meeting will be *September 6th, 2017*, where they will create warm and cozy shawls and lap robes, which are lovingly brought to the sick and homebound.
