



Week 4: The Birth of Yes, our Surrender to Life and Love

Our Advent time is moving along— time for listening and responding. Mary and Elizabeth both were women of listening, as were Joseph and Zechariah (who get short changed in these lectionary readings). Both couples listened to voices that came quite mysteriously, by angels, and in dreams and brought forth a word of YES, to the path drawn out before them. Mary and Joseph, Elizabeth and Zechariah, spoke their YES with great faith, but not without trepidation.

Is it possible that Joseph accompanied Mary to Elizabeth and Zechariah's home and then Joseph returned to his carpenter trade in Nazareth? Probably so. Nevertheless, the YES, the surrender to YHWH's plan, God's Love Design, was lived out day-by-day, step-by-step, in prayer and in everyday actions.

Joseph made plans to go down to Jerusalem and Bethlehem for the pre-ordained census— scratching his head perhaps and wondering how it would all work out. We know the rest of the story, but he and Mary surely did not. Their YES was firm. They would be steadfast as the Promise was to be fulfilled. God is Faithful.

Do I, like Mary and Joseph, Elizabeth and Zechariah, believe the Promise, and say YES to God's Fidelity, God's Plan? Will I become silent, listen more and speak less in my prayer and with others?


How do I recognize the Presence in dreams, through angels, and through others, when I least expect a visitation? Where am I willing to go to share the Good News of Christ, the Birth of Yes?

The visitation is so familiar that sometimes we miss the significance of this event. Elizabeth, beyond child bearing years, and Mary, who had not yet been with a man, are both pregnant. Each in her own way was trying to understand what seemed impossible. Instead of responding with doubt, fear, shame, or any other such feeling, they interacted with amazement, joy, and wonder. Elizabeth in her wisdom spoke to Mary of her incredible faith, her trust that what was spoken to her would be fulfilled.

As we continue these final days of waiting and preparing for Christmas, are we aware of the words that God is speaking to us? Have we given our yes to God's purpose in our life? Do we believe that God can accomplish great things in and through us? In these final days of Advent listen closely and trust God so that what has been spoken to you by the Lord will be fulfilled. *Prayer: Loving God, still our hearts so that we can hear your word. Open us to the mystery of what you are doing in our lives. Give us the faith to believe that what you have spoken to us will be fulfilled. Personal challenge: Live in the wonder that what has been spoken to you by God will be fulfilled.*

Advent as Countercultural- I believe Advent is the most countercultural season for Christians. People worry about what kind of decorations to put up and what kind of gifts to buy. They're afraid of feeling guilty if the gifts they give are not as nice as those they receive. Isn't that ironic? We have so much fear and guilt over the birth of the One who came to take away our fear and guilt. So the Church offers us a whole other way to move through this season.

Consider Advent's symbols: Ouiet, as opposed to noise. Take time to read from the Bible or another spiritual book, and reflect in quiet. **Darkness**. Nights are longer, reminding us of the darkness and cold of a world without Christ. *Waiting*, as opposed to rushing around. We can redeem the moments we spend in traffic or in line by being cheerful with the people in line, helping others with packages or offering a quiet prayer for those around us. After all, the whole purpose
