Program vouchers for Cleveland residents. A recent change to
state law now allows private high schools in certain cities
adjacent to the city of Cleveland to accept the Cleveland
Scholarship Program voucher and the city of Lakewood meets
the standard of the law.

The value of the voucher for grades 9-12 is currently \$5,770 per
year, which can be applied to the cost of tuition at St. Edward
High School. In addition to the amount, families may still apply
for need-based financial aid to help cover the remaining cost of
