# YEAR OF CONSECRATED LIFE CONCLUDES & THE JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY BEGINS

Holy Father Pope Francis has declared a **JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY** celebration to begin on **December 8, 2015**, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, and conclude on Sunday, November 20, 2016, the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, the King of the Universe.

Since the 15th Century, a Holy Door has been used as a ritual expression of conversion during Jubilee Years. Those who traveled to a cathedral or a basilica or a designated church for reconciliation entered through the Holy Door, crossing the threshold from sin to grace, from slavery to freedom and from darkness to light.

The opening of the Holy Doors of Mercy for the Diocese of Cleveland will take place at the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist at 10:15 a.m. on December 13, 2015, just prior to the celebration of the 10:30 a.m. Mass.

During the YEAR OF CONSECRATED LIFE we have highlighted some of the sons and daughters of our Parish who entered religious life as brothers, sisters and priests. Although the year officially ended on November 21 we still have some stories to tell and we hope to include them in future issues of the church bulletin. We have one more story to finish out this year.

Our pastor, Fr. Joseph Hilinski, entered the seminary from St. Patrick Parish in West Park and was ordained a priest on June 8, 1974, but we can still claim him as one of our own since he was baptized by Fr. Joseph Jarosz here at St. Barbara's on September 5, 1948.

Although Fr. Hilinski considered several career options including joining the merchant marines or studying the law and working in

the legal profession, he was already thinking about the priesthood at an early age. This picture, courtesy of the Hilinski family, shows a young Joseph praying at the altar in his family's home.
