# DIOCESAN MINISTRY TO THE INCARCERATED LEAF Ministry

**LEAF** stands for: Listening, Encouraging, and Assisting Families. Begun in 2014, the **LEAF** Program now has 8 meeting sites including one nearby at **Mary Queen of Peace Church**, 4423 Pearl Road.

The **LEAF** program offers support and encouragement to those who have loved ones who are incarcerated. The meetings at Mary Queen of Peace are held on the **fourth Wednesday of the month** in the Parish Center at 7:00 p.m. and are usually concluded by 9:00 p.m.

In a recent article in the *Old Brooklyn News*, Pastor Fr. Doug Brown wrote that "those who have attended meetings have found understanding and compassionate listeners who help in coming to terms with the separation of a loved one who is imprisoned. Meetings also include a sharing of resources as those who have had experience with the prison system share institutional tips with those facing new family situations."
