

ST. WOJCIECH, Bishop & Martyr Feast Day April 23

St. Wojciech was born into a noble family in Bohemia in 956 -- 10 years before Mieszko I, King of Poland, was baptized and Poland became a Christian nation. In 970, Wojciech was sent to Magdeburg, capital of the Prussian Province of Saxony, to be educated. At his confirmation he took the name of his mentor, the first archbishop of Magdeburg, *Adalbert*. In 981, he returned to Prague to do missionary work, and soon became the second Bishop of Prague.

Conflict developed between the Bishop and Boleslaus II, the duke of Bohemia, and in 990, Wojciech left for Rome, where he became a monk. He was ordered back to Prague two years later. In 995 Pope Gregory V released him from his episcopal duties after the massacre of his family by an order of Boleslaus II. In 966, Bolesław I Chrobry ("Boleslaw the brave"), duke of Poland and son of King Mieszko I, invited Wojciech to evangelize the Baltic Prussians to Christianity. While engaged in his missionary work Wojciech was killed in 997 when he was suspected by the Prussians of being a Polish spy. Bolesław I buried Wojciech's body at Gniezno, Poland, but some of his relics were returned by force to Prague in 1039. He was canonized a saint in the year 999.

St. Wojciech is considered to be the author of *Bogurodzica* (Mother of God), the oldest Polish hymn. Polish knights sung it as an anthem before the Battle of Grunwald in1410 A.D. and during the battle with the Turkish army in 1444 A.D. It was also sung at the coronation ceremonies of the first Jagiellonian kings of Poland. In the 19th century it became regarded as the "hymn of the motherland" and has held that honor to the present day.

In June 1997, to mark the 1000th anniversary of martyrdom of St. Wojciech (St. Adalbert) Pope John Paul II visited Gniezno and held a ceremonial service in which the heads of seven European states and about a million believers took part.

St. Wojciech is represented in one of the 3 stained glass windows in our church which depict Polish saints. Funding for this window was donated by parishioners John and Mary Nowak when our church was built in 1952.
