ONE MORE TO REMEMBER

Parishioner Benet Konarski has brought to our attention the story of a member of St. Barbara's parish who died as a serviceman while on active duty in Korea.

Robert Bellus was born on October 18, 1929, in Jersey City, New Jersey. His father died when he was young and his mother later married Steve Solinsky. The 1940 census has the Solinsky family living on Pixley Court off of West 22nd Place and Kenneth Avenue in the St. Barbara neighborhood. We are not able to determine when Robert started to attend St. Barbara School. He is listed in the 1940 annual report as being a student in the third grade and the sacramental registry lists him as receiving his First Communion on May 19, 1940.

Benet tells us that Robert enlisted in the Army at an early age and served for three years. Upon completing his service he returned home and was working. He decided to re-enlist in the Army when the Korean War began in July 1950 and re-joined the 23rd Infantry Regiment, 2nd Infantry Division. Sadly, less than 2 months later, on August 31, 1950, he was killed in action while fighting in South Korea.

Private First Class Bellus was awarded the Purple Heart, the Combat Infantryman's Badge, the Korean Service Medal, the United Nations Service Medal, the National Defense Service Medal, the Korean Presidential Unit Citation and the Republic of Korea War Service Medal. He was buried in Arlington National Cemetery in Washington, D.C.

On this MEMORIAL DAY and every day, let us remember Robert Bellus and all those men and women who died in service to our country. May they rest in peace.
