YEAR OF MERCY SEPTEMBER ACTIVITY: GIVE DRINK TO THE THIRSTY

We had an opportunity to learn about the **HOUSE OF CHAMPIONS** when Sister Nan Zeimet, a Notre Dame Sister, came to speak to us as part of our Lenten Reflections series this past spring. At that time some of our parishioners asked how we might be of some help to the children.

The HOUSE OF CHAMPIONS, located in a rented house on West 47th Street, off of Lorain Avenue. in Cleveland, provides an after-school, nurturing and safe setting with a family-like environment where a small group of selected children in grades one to four have additional opportunities to learn life skills which will give them the confidence to succeed. The focus is on strengthening academic achievements, practicing communication techniques, and learning respectful and appropriate social skills.

Children arrive about 3:00, have a snack, and begin homework. Volunteers help individuals with homework and reading storybooks. After completing homework, the children learn social skills by playing outside or inside depending on the weather. At 5:30 the children wash up for dinner and help set the table. Dinner is at 6:00 each day. After dinner, the children assist the adults with dish clean-up. Social skills continue to be learned with more play time until they are picked up by parents or designated relatives at 8:00 and most often a little earlier.
