
FUNERAL MASS

ADVENT

Advent is the beginning of the New Church Year. Our theme for this year is: Let us be concerned for each other, to stir a response in love and good works. Hebrews 10:24



THE BEGINNING OF THE CHURCH YEAR

Since the 900s Advent has been considered the beginning of the church year. This does not mean that Advent is the most important time of the year. The Easter cycle has always had this honor. The distinction happened from the practice of placing the liturgical texts for Advent at the beginning of the hand-copied books used for Mass. They had to begin somewhere.

The beginning of Advent always falls on the Sunday nearest the feast of St. Andrew the Apostle, November 30. As a preparation season, like Lent, it has no meaning in itself. It looks forward to the annual celebration of Jesus's birth, both the historical event itself and the saving event of the coming of God in flesh.

Advent has always been somewhat confused. It blends together a penitential spirit very similar to Lent, a liturgical theme of preparation for the Second and Final Coming of the Lord, called the Parousia, and a joyful theme of getting ready for the Bethlehem event. Religious traditions associated with Advent give expression to all these themes.

The word Advent (from the Latin *adventus*, "coming") originally described the whole mystery of the Incarnation. The conception of Jesus was an Advent, but so was his birth and what will be his final coming at the end-times. In a more popular sense, Advent was first associated with the time of the year now called Christmastime and finally with the weeks of preparation for Christmas.
