#WeGIVECATHOLIC REPORT ON GIVING

This past Tuesday we participated in **WeGiveCatholic Day**, the first-ever, online one day of Catholic giving in Northeast Ohio which raised awareness and support for 157 Catholic parishes, schools, ministries, Catholic Charities sites, programs, and Catholic nonprofits.

By the end of the day, a grand total of 4,147 gifts were received for a total amount raised of \$414.199. Highest on the leader board was Lake Catholic High School with 327 gifts. Of the 157 participants, there were 32 parishes and organizations that received from 1 to 3 gifts, with amounts ranging from \$10 to \$1,000. St. Barbara Parish received 3 gifts amounting to \$85.00. We thank our three donors. This was a new experience for us and we were glad to be able to participate and show our support to the Diocese for this event.

THE COLORS OF ADVENT

The color of Advent is purple or violet. It symbolizes a penitential spirit that has been associated with this season. Traditionally on the third Sunday of Advent, rose-colored vestments have been used. This color anticipates and is symbolic of the Christmas joy announced in the first word of the Entrance Antiphon: Rejoice (in Latin, *Gaudete*)
