HISTORICAL NOTE: St. Barbara Veterans Club and Memorial Day

During World War II, there were over 16 million members of the United States Armed Forces. According to the Department of Veterans Affairs, around 620,000 American veterans from that war were estimated to still be alive as of 2016. The general decline in the number of veterans along with changes in members' location and health, and the lack of younger individuals joining, has resulted in many Veterans clubs and organizations across the country disbanding. The **St. Barbara's Veterans Club** was also affected by these changes and in the fall of 2016, the remaining members decided to dissolve the Club.

Almost 70 years ago on November 4, 1947, the first meeting of the St. Barbara' Veterans Club was held in the Parish Hall (formerly the wooden church on the corner where the present church now stands). Thirty-eight members were present. One of the first acts of business was to plan for a social event for the parish and to raise some funds. Through the years there were dances, picnics and day trips and for a few years the Club sponsored a baseball team.

In 1959 a raffle was held to raise funds for a monument to be placed in front of the church as a memorial to those from the parish who died in the war. The Memorial Day ceremonies, always on May 30 (even after the date was changed to a Monday observance), continued for many years. The annual event will always be associated with Mr. Ted Sliwa, a founding member of the Vets Club who died in 2014. Denison Avenue would be closed for a parade that would start on West 25th Street. School children, Blue and Gold Star mothers, Knights of Columbus, Veterans, and distinguished guests would participate. In 1965 the Lincoln High School band and majorettes joined in the march. There were speakers in front of the monument and active servicemen provided an honor guard and a salute.

Memorial Day at St. Barbara's always began with a Mass. The names on the monument were read and a candle was lit for each fallen serviceman. The tradition continues to this day.
