SECOND COLLECTION, Next Weekend, October 7-8, 2017 Calamities

The past month has presented us with a seemingly unprecedented number of natural disasters. The toll on human life, property, livelihoods, and faith communities is immense and the full extent will not be known for some time. The faithful of the Diocese of Cleveland have been generous in their prayers, outreach and donations toward the recent emergency collections for Hurricanes Harvey and Irma. Once again the Catholic Diocese of Cleveland and dioceses across the country have been asked by the leadership of the U. S. Conference of Catholic Bishops to encourage people to continue their generosity to help those affected by Hurricane Maria and those in central Mexico, where a 7.1 magnitude earthquake hit.

The USCCB Office of National Collections has set up funds for both disasters to receive any contributions our diocese, parishes or individual wish to make. Contributed funds will be used to support the reconstruction and pastoral needs of the church as well as humanitarian and recovery assistance through Catholic Charities USA (Hurricane Maria) and Catholic Relief Services (Mexico earthquake.) All checks should be made payable to *St. Barbara Parish* with the memo marked **2017 Calamities**. A totaled single check to the Diocese Finance Office will be submitted from our parish.
