Retrouvaille is a three-month program to help couples struggling in their marriages. It has three phases, starting with a weekend experience in which couples learn to re-establish communication and to gain new insights into themselves as individuals and as a couple. Post sessions are held over a period of 12 weeks to further develop and enhance the techniques learned on the weekend. LEAF stands for: Listening, Encouraging, and Assisting Families. Groups meet monthly offering an opportunity to those who come to listen and share community, network and learn from others who understand their situation, challenges, fears and emotions. All are welcome to participate irrespective of faith affiliation. No preregistration is necessary.

Begun in the Diocese in 2014, the LEAF Program now has 8 meeting sites including one nearby at **Mary Queen of Peace Church**, 4423 Pearl Road. The meetings at Mary Queen of Peace are held on the fourth Wednesday of the month in the Parish Center at 7:00 p.m. and are usually concluded by 9:00

THE ST. BARBARA PARISH GUILD

When St. Barbara School was closed in 1969 due to low enrollment, the Parent Teachers Unit (PTU), which had been meeting for 30 years, also came to an end. Fr. Joseph Jarosz was interested in having



the former members of the PTU start a new parish organization, the **Ladies Guild**. Fr. Thaddeus Swirsky helped to get the new organization started and the first meeting was held in the fall of 1969.

During Fr. Michael Dyrcz's time at our parish he wanted to increase participation in the Ladies Guild so he proposed that the name be changed to the **Parish Guild** and membership was extended to the men of the parish.

When our church was reopened in 2012 the Parish Guild was reestablished and members have been involved in parish activities ever since.

Every November, in the month of all souls, we remember and pray for those who gave their time and talents to this parish organization over the years. A Mass for the deceased members of the St. Barbara Parish Guild will be offered this **Sunday, November 12** at 9:00 a.m.
