POLISH CONSTITUTION DAY CELEBRATION



Polish Constitution Day commemorates May 3, 1791, the day on which the Polish-Lithuanian Commonwealth's constitution was adopted. It was the first constitution in modern Europe and second in the world, following the American one.

This year's observance of Polish Constitution Day will highlight the 100th Anniversary of the restoration of Poland's sovereignty as the Second Polish Republic in 1918 from the German, Austrian and Russian Empires. Following the partitions in the late 18th century, Poland ceased to exist on the map for 123 years until the end of World War I, when the destruction of the neighboring powers enabled Poland to reemerge.

To celebrate there will be a week of festivities, including 2 parades:

Sunday, April 29, starting at 1:30 p.m. Grand Parade through Slavic Village starting at E. 50th & Fleet Avenue concluding at East 65th and Lansing Avenue, Sponsored by the Polish Constitution Day Committee. *Deadline for registering is April 22.*

Sunday, May 6, starting at 2:00 P.M. from Ridge Road at Parma Circle parade will head North and proceed to Ridge and Snow Roads. Sponsored by the Polish American Congress - Ohio Division. *Deadline for registering is April 27.*
