PENTECOST

***Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful
and kindle in them the fire of your love***

The Easter season lasts for fifty days, ending with Pentecost (from the Greek pentekoste, "fiftieth"). It celebrates the overwhelming experience of God pouring out the Spirit upon the first community of those who believed Jesus was the Lord and Christ. Pentecost is called, therefore, the birth of the church or the birth of the church's mission.

The color of vestments and decoration for Pentecost is red. It symbolizes the intense love and fire of the Holy Spirit. Other symbols of the Pentecost event are the dove, the tongues of flame and wind.
