CELEBRATING THOSE FROM OUR PARISH WHO HAVE SERVED IN RELIGIOUS LIFE

During the special **Year of Consecrated Life** in 2015, we highlighted a few of the sons and daughters of our parish who entered religious life as brothers, sisters and priests. Recently, the Sisters of St. Joseph - Third Order of St. Francis published a special issue of **Peace & All Good: Jubilee 2018**. The issue contains stories about sisters who are celebrating their jubilees this year, including Sr. Alice Chmura (Sr. Mary Bonaventure) who is celebrating her 70th anniversary. We have been given permission to reprint the following article in our bulletin so that we can share this story with you about this daughter of St. Barbara's parish who answered the call to religious life.

Sister Alice Chmura (Sister Mary Bonaventure) 70 Years



I was the seventh child of eight born to Martin and Victoria Chmura, very devoted and church-minded parents. It seemed like St. Barb's (St. Barbara Parish in Cleveland) was our second home. At the time, Fr. Solinski was the pastor and the school was staffed by the Franciscan Sisters-Sylvania, OH. Two

of my sisters entered that community.

When Fr. J. Jarosz became pastor, he asked for the Sisters of St. Joseph of the Third Order of St. Francis to teach at the school. I was taught by our Sisters in grade school and at Marymount High School. It was during my years in high school and under the guidance of Sister Anicita, I felt being called to enter the convent. Becoming a Sister is something I began thinking about in seventh grade because of the example and influence of Sister Oswaldine. I entered the convent after graduation in 1947.

Instead of completing my scholastic year as a novice, I was sent out to teach. I taught in Michigan and Ohio schools for nearly 30 years.

In 1977, I was giving permission to take care of my mother. During this time, I served as a lector at St. Barb's – both in Polish and English. I considered it a privilege. From 1989 to 2016, I was the Marymount Congregational Home treasurer, retiring in 2016. Now, I have 70 years of memories to look back on. Prayers come first and then I don't feel guilty about relaxing, reading Christian novels and working crossword puzzles. I love to bake breads and cook.

I am grateful and wonderfully blessed to be a Sister of St. Joseph of the Third Order of St. Francis, ever grateful for the opportunities I had for my personal growth—spiritually, mentally and physically.

I say this daily: "God is my boss. God is our boss 24/7 and He doesn't want our help. The best part about this is that He won't fire us. Don't quit on Him. Do all you do for God's greater glory."
