"Why do Catholics....."

Why do Catholics believe in the Trinity? Though the word "Trinity" is not in the bible, there are many verses that reveal this doctrine of three divine persons in one God: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit..." (Matt29:19); all 3 are mentioned at the baptism of Jesus (Luke 3:21-22,Matt 3:16-17); Jesus says he will send the Holy Spirit (John 15:26); Paul greets the people with the Trinity (2Cor 13:14); etc. Each person of the Trinity is in union with each other (Father begets the Son, the Holy Spirit is the love that proceeds from them) and yet are distinct: Father-Creator, Son-Sanctifier, Holy Spirit-Counselor. We include the Trinity in several prayers: Glory Be, The Creed, Gloria in the Mass, etc. and it is the model for the Christian "family".

WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR THE POOR: Pope Francis proclaimed last Sunday the World Day of Prayer for the Poor. Word was late getting from Rome to Columbus Grove, but we can still reflect profitably on the occasion.

Let's face it: ministry to the poor makes us nervous. "What if they try to take advantage of us?" we wonder. Isn't this an unending commitment with more needs – and more needs – and more needs? We ask, "Why do they keep making bad decisions? Why can't they be like us?" Sometimes people are quite unappealing because they have been exploited – or because sometimes, the exploitation has been going on for generations. Sometimes people are poor because racism has kept them in their place.

The Church has reached out to, and welcomed poor people. For example, the Campaign for Human Development has given many people a boost into independence. Catholic schools have helped generations of poor children to be confident in their gifts and to grow intellectually and spiritually – results that might never have occurred if their parents' only choice was a failed public school system.

When Pope Francis preached about last Sunday's parable, the parable about the sums of money that the master entrusted to the servants, he said, "The Gospel parable speaks of gifts. It tells us that we have received talents from God, "according to ability of each". Before all else, let us realize this: we do have talents; in God's eyes, we are 'talented'. Consequently, no one can think that he or she is useless, so poor as to be incapable of giving something to others. We are chosen and blessed by God, who wants to fill us with his gifts, more than any father or mother does with their own children. And God, in whose eyes no child can be neglected, entrusts to each of us a mission.

"In the parable, we see that each servant is given talents to use wisely. But whereas the first two servants do what they are charged, the third does not make his talents bear fruit; he gives back only what he had received. 'I was afraid' – he says – 'and I went and hid your talent in the ground. Here you have what is yours'. As a result, he is harshly rebuked as 'wicked and lazy'. What made the Master displeased with him?... All too often, we have the idea that we haven't done anything wrong, and so we rest content, presuming that we are good and just. But in this way we risk acting like the unworthy servant: he did no wrong, he didn't waste the talent, in fact he kept it carefully hidden in the ground. But to do no wrong is not enough. God is not an inspector looking for unstamped tickets; he is a Father looking for children to whom he can entrust his property and his plans. It is sad when the Father of love does not receive a generous response of love from His children, who do no more than keep the rules and follow the commandments, like hired hands in the house of the Father.

"There, in the poor, we find the presence of Jesus, who, though rich, became poor. For this reason, in them, in their weakness, a 'saving power' is present. And if in the eyes of the world they have little value, they are the ones who open to us the way to heaven; they are our 'passport to paradise'. For us it is an evangelical duty to care for them, as our real riches, and to do so not only by giving them bread, but also by breaking with them the bread of God's word, which is addressed first to them. To love the poor means to combat all forms of poverty, spiritual and material."

A PRAYER TO CHRIST THE KING: At last Tuesday's deanery meeting, we began with this prayer to Christ the King, and I would like to share it with you.

"O Jesus Christ, I acknowledge you as universal King. All that has been made has been created for You. Exercise all Your rights over me. I renew my baptismal vows. I renounce Satan, his pomps and his works; I promise to live as a good Christian. And, in particular I do pledge myself to labor, to the best of my ability, for the triumph of the rights of God and of Your Church. Divine Heart of Jesus, to You do I offer my poor services, laboring that all hearts may acknowledge Your sacred kingship, and that thus the reign of Your peace be established throughout the whole universe. Amen.
