"Why do Catholics....."

Why do Catholics celebrate Christmas on Dec 25? This is rooted in tradition to celebrate Christ's birth, the *Incarnation*, not as a memorial of a specific day since the exact date is unknown. The Catholic Church used this date to reform a pagan holiday of the winter solstice and make it holy. After the winter solstice, the sun appears to regain its strength, is "born again" as it were, as the days become longer. Consequently, December 25th was the "birthday" of the Persian sun-god known as Mithras. Over 2000 years ago, Christ entered this pagan world and reformed and sanctified it by His presence. The word Christmas means "the Mass of Christ". It is the central event as it marks the arrival of Immanuel, "God With Us", the Word became Flesh, the promised Savior of the World, marking the most significant birth ever. It is an occasion to spread the Good News of the Gospel at a time when many unbelievers pause to consider Christ. Share Christ with someone this Christmas, as our gift back to God!

MERRY CHRISTMAS! I read in Wednesday's news that the government of North Korea has just passed a law forbidding loud, raucous parties with singing and/or alcohol consumption during late December. It makes me wonder if they're afraid of Christmas. Would Ebenezer Scrooge have felt at home in North Korea? Or how about King Herod?

Christmas is the ultimate celebration of life and freedom. Jesus coming as a baby says that each human life is precious to God and must be reverenced. I'm grateful that most Americans stand for that. I'm grateful that the First Amendment allows us to gather in awe and wonder of the Christ-Event. I'm grateful that we are allowed to let our faith spill over into our political opinions and our political speech. And I'm grateful for the people I celebrate with. Maybe Scrooge, Herod and the rulers of North Korea are afraid of people gathering to celebrate Christmas, and then upholding reverence for human life. When the Son of God became one of the least ones, His example shouted loudly the message of the infinite value of each human life. So after Mass, enjoy family and friends, be loud and raucous with them, sing Christmas carols together, and enjoy a glass of "whatever" to increase your joy (in moderation, of course).
