BIRTHDAY CARDS: One of the little perks of being pastor is that I get cards from all the kids on my birthday. It's good to read all their sincere wishes. Every now and then, I get a card with a real zinger in it. One said, "How old are you? My guess is 50." I've sent orders to the faculty that that child is to get straight A's for the next two years. Another wrote, "Your birthday means that you are another year closer to seeing Jesus." I know that's why we're here, to see Jesus one day, but I'll bet Hallmark will never print a card like that.

One of the older parishioners told me that when Father Keith McCormack celebrated his 40th, her grandchild's card to Fr. Keith said, "You're not just over the hill, you're over the Alps." That grandchild has since become a very responsible parishioner; so there's always hope.

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS RECRUITMENT: The Knights of Columbus will have a recruitment drive after Masses next weekend, October 22-23. There's a lot more to the Knights of Columbus besides a spiffy uniform for Fourth Degree members and snacks after meetings (although I can appreciate both). According to the annual report from Supreme Knight Carl Anderson, the Knights gave over \$175 million to charities in 2015, and donated 73.5 million service hours. 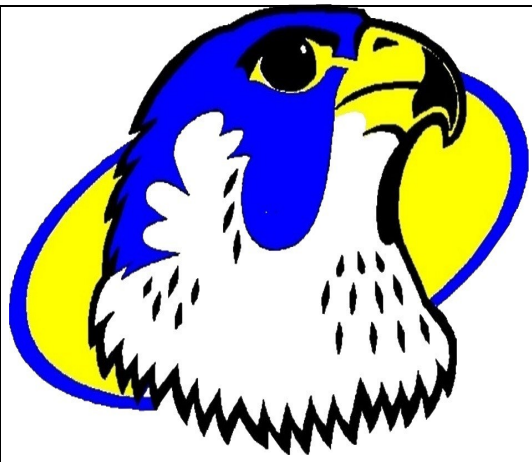
CATHOLIC CHARITIES/ PROPAGATION OF THE FAITH: The total gift to Catholic Charities for flood relief in Louisiana came to almost \$2100. Thank you for your generosity! If we are to be faithful to the mission Jesus gave us ("Go forth and teach all nations...") it is absolutely crucial that we support people who are announcing the Good News in mission settings.

WHERE HAVE ALL THE BREVIARIES GONE? At a recent parish meeting, one of the parishioners asked if priests still have breviaries. We definitely do, only they're now called *Liturgy of the Hours*. The old name, "breviary," was related to the word "brief." It was called that because it gathered psalms, readings, hymns etc. into one volume. Sometimes it was referred to as the *Divine Office*. "Office" comes from the Latin word "officium" which means "duty". That may not be the best way to think about prayer.

The new name is a reminder that the purpose of the Church's prayer is to sanctify the day by praying the Psalms at morning, noon, evening and night. In the 1960s the directions for praying it were greatly simplified. Before then the structure was very complicated, if you wanted to get it right. And it was considerably longer. In those days priests, sisters and deacons did the entire Book of Psalms every week; now we pray the all the Psalms in the course of a month. I'm glad for simplified directions and for the shortening of the prayer times. It makes the whole experience more prayerful and a lot less hurried.

The Liturgy of the Hours is the prayer of the whole Church. I reflect sometimes that I'm praying the same Psalms as Pope Francis, the missionaries in Alaska, and the chaplains on the aircraft carriers. We are encouraged to pray the Liturgy of the Hours with parishioners too. We will pray Vespers at 7 p.m. this Wednesday at the close of the Rosary day with the Pilgrim Virgin statue, and again as part of our All Souls devotion at 2 p.m. on November 6.
