"Why do Catholics....."

"Why do Catholics have Priests?" St. Paul taught that Christ's Church would have a hierarchy composed of deacons (1 *Tim 3:8-13*); presbyters, from which comes the English word "priest" (1 *Tim 5:17*); and bishops (1 *Tim 3:1-7*). The Old Testament talks about priests several places in Exodus and Leviticus. In the New Testament, Jesus Christ is the *new high priest* in His divinity and His sacrifice on the cross. The gospels and letters tell us that Christ gave us the sacraments for priests to offer in His place (*Persona Christi*) such as the Eucharist, Reconciliation and Anointing of the Sick. Only men can be priests to stand in the person of Christ and serve Christ's bride, the Church (*Eph 5:22-33*). Priests are unmarried, or celebate (*1Cor 7:32*) as a *discipline* rather than an unchanging *dogma*.

NEW VESTMENTS and SOME NOT SO NEW: We have received a new set of priest/deacon white vestments in honor of Don Siefker's ordination to the diaconate. We are very grateful for this gift. We will use them for the first time at Christmas. They were made by Jane Schimmoeller of Fort Jennings. I'm sure you will appreciate the quality of Jane's workmanship, and the quality of the material she chose. In going through the closets to make room for them, we found several sets that we are sure we will never use; with the help of Audrey Ruthman, we are donating these to a needy diocese in Guatemala.


At the back of the closet, we also found some really beautiful vestments that had been forgotten. They have just returned from the dry-cleaners, and I intend to use them from time to time. So please do not imagine that I just spent a fortune on vestments. All I'm doing is enjoying a newly donated set, and resurrecting some old vestments that had been forgotten too long.

CHURCH DOOR LOCKS: For many months we've been locking our church doors at night. We also have cameras in a couple of places that are activated by motion detectors. Now we've refined the system by installing an automatic lock on the east-side main vestibule door. This door will automatically lock at 10 p.m. and unlock at 7 a.m. The doors on the parking-lot side (including the elevator door) are supposed to be locked and unlocked by an electric timer, but that part of the system doesn't seem to work. We are trying to find out what it will take to make those timed locks operable again. All other doors will be locked manually in the late afternoon or early evening and then unlocked early in the morning. I will be glad not to have to make a late-night patrol to lock up. And the worse the weather gets, the gladder I will be.

GRATITUDE IS IMPORTANT: When someone does an act of kindness for a little child, the parents or grandparents will frequently have to say, "Now Jimmy, what do you say to Mr. Jones for giving you the candy?" And Mr. Jones gets a mumbled "Thank you." I'm glad that almost all of our students no longer need that parental reminder when I hold a door open for them or host a hot lunch for my birthday.

Gratitude is a way of saying "I need you. I need the respect you just showed me. I get by with a little help from my friends" (to quote the Beatles.) And on the human level, we feel affirmed when someone shows gratitude. Now God does not need our gratitude. He is supremely happy in and of Himself. We are the ones who need to show God gratitude. We need daily reminders that we haven't created the good things or good human relationships that we enjoy. We need daily reminders that we need the other people that God has surrounded us with. I just read an article about a young man who fancies himself a neo-Nazi, and totally rejects all other people (unless he can use them). What a miserable existence.

Our Thanksgiving celebration started at Friday's school Mass, and will continue on Thanksgiving morning at 9 a.m. It's just one more way of being reminded how blessed we really are.
