Why do Catholics Celebrate the 7 Sacraments? Christ instituted the sacraments and handed them down, entrusting them to the apostles for His church. Sacraments are outward signs that we experience with our senses. They are efficacious, meaning capable of producing a desired effect. Each sacrament conveys its gift, proper to itself, sanctifying grace, which is God's free, undeserved favor and a participation in His life, making us holy. They require proper disposition on our part, receiving them worthily, in order for them to bear fruit. There are 7 which is symbolic of perfection or wholeness. Three are of initiation: Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. Two are of healing: Reconciliation and Anointing of the Sick. Two are of service: Holy Orders and Matrimony. The 7 sacraments renew and make visible the mystery of God's love. They strengthen and express our Christian faith. They instruct, sanctify us, build up the body of Christ and give worship to God. They each meet us in a key moment of our life and renew a key value from the life and ministry of Jesus. Next week we will explain this further.

Never think for a minute that they're not listening, no matter how young they are.


CHURCH PAINTING: First of all, thanks to all the people who gave of their time to set up the hall and make it as worthy of Jesus Christ as we possibly can. It will not be totally convenient; it will not be as beautiful as our church, but we can put up with it for two months. After all, the generation before us put up with it for 15 years.

Just a few notes:

- 1. We will put the padded chairs at the front of the hall. These will be for the use of people who use walkers or wheelchairs, or who have some other disability. If you sit up front, please give your place to people with disabilities, if necessary.
- 2. The Blessed Sacrament will be reserved on the stage in one of our spare tabernacles. If there must be a social event in the hall, we will remove the Blessed Sacrament to the rectory living room. So that calls for the same reverence downstairs as we had upstairs.
- 3. If there must be a social event in the hall, please see me. I will work with the chairman or the president of the organization to accommodate your needs as far as humanly possible. I would only ask that after the event, chairs be set up for Mass as you found them.
- 4. Hymnals and missalettes will be on library carts near each entrance. Greeters and ushers, please assist people with taking one of each. After Mass, please return them to the cart in order to keep the hall/church neat and clean.
- 5. Priests' and deacons' vestments and servers' robes will be kept upstairs. We will vest upstairs, and then walk downstairs for the opening procession.
- 6. The Stations of the Cross are photographs of the Stations at Glandorf. Thanks to Fr. Tony Fortman for letting us borrow them. We will have to return them in the same excellent condition in which we received them
- 7. No one is expected to kneel during the Eucharistic Prayer. Concrete floors are hard on knees that have traveled lots of miles, so kneeling will be optional. Let's agree that most of us will stand during the Eucharistic Prayer unless, of course, it is impossible for you to stand that long.
- 8. The platform in the north end will be reserved for the choir.
- 9. When there is a social event in the hall, I would ask you to keep children away from the stage/sanctuary. There will be too many breakable items up there, and we all know what children are like when they are burning off sugar from delicious St. Anthony desserts. So that area should be off limits. Please keep children away from the organ. (The organ was given to the garage sale at the 2017 festival; we set it aside for our painting project. We will offer it for sale at the 2018 festival.) Children like to explore and to find out what all the switches and buttons on the organ will do, but they shouldn't. Repairs to a delicate electronic instrument are expensive.
- 10.In the event of a funeral, please know that the hall cannot accommodate both a Mass of Christian Burial and the following lunch. I can't conceive of a way to cook a funeral lunch on one side of the divider while Mass is being celebrated on the other. People will have the option of "borrowing" a neighboring church and then having a funeral lunch at St. Anthony, or else having the funeral Mass at St. Anthony, and then "borrowing" a hall for the lunch.

This will be a new experience for many of us. I know it will be new for me. We will have to forgive each other for any discomfort or misunderstandings that result. With forbearance and good humor, I know we can make our way through this project.
