**THEOLOGY OF MARRIAGE – A FOLLOW-UP:** Last Sunday there wasn't time to say everything that the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* has to say about marriage. So I would like to do a follow-up article. First I would like to say a word to older couples and to other couples who for whatever reason have difficulty in bearing children. I said that the two purposes of marriage are the happy union of the couple and the conception of children. If a couple is not having children, are they second-class members of the Church, or even somewhat suspect? No, they are honored full members of the Church. The Church doesn't demand that couples do the impossible. We don't teach that every marital embrace must result in a child. Older couples and couples without children are in many cases dedicated servants of life. They put their spouses ahead of themselves. They witness to God's love before their nieces, nephews and grandchildren. Theirs is not a second-class calling; it's just a different calling, one among the several vocations that God gives to adult Church members.

Some people may wonder why, if the Church has such a positive view of marriage, why its priests and religious don't marry. There are laws against priests marrying going all the way back to the first ecumenical council in 325 AD. It seems though that it took about 900 years for the law to "sink in", because Church councils and Popes kept repeating it, and repeating it over and over again. Part of the problem was that priests in the early Middle Ages kept trying to bequeath the parish's assets to their children, which caused great upset among parishioners and bishops. But there is a much deeper reason for the celibacy of bishops, priests and religious. There have always been women and men in the Church who gave up the great good of marriage in order to be a sign that our bond with Jesus Christ is more important than any human relationship. It's also a sign of the kingdom of heaven. Celibacy puts Jesus first and asserts the Lordship that He will make visible when He comes again.

Is it a difficult calling? If anyone does well with celibacy, it's a sign that God has poured out His grace on that person. Unfortunately, there have been priests who have dealt with celibacy by asserting control over parishioners in unhealthy ways, or in owning the latest things. When I was in the seminary, the spiritual director referred to it as "having it-children," and warned of what harm this would do to a priest personally and to the morale of the parish. Some priests have dealt with celibacy in much more destructive ways. I won't re-tell those depressing stories here. What I am asking for is prayers, not just for myself but also for all priests and sisters, that we may remain faithful to our calling.

The *Catechism* also has a word for laypersons who are single. It says that many of them live their situation by serving God and their neighbor in exemplary ways. The great family of the Church must be open to all of them. This section ends with a quote from Saint John Paul's encyclical on the family: "No one is without a family in this world; the Church is a home and family for everyone, especially those who 'labor and are heavy laden.""

We have one inquirer so far. I'm sure I can rely on parishioners once again to invite more people to look into the Catholic Church.

R.C.I.A. may take place in the daytime this year, since our inquirer is presently working second shift. I have let the other parishes of our deanery know (as well as Delphos and Lima) that we are willing to serve anyone from their parishes who can't come in the evening. We will, of course, accommodate all inquirers, regardless of their personal schedule.
