The stories you share about yourself encourages them, and the stories they share encourage you that you are not alone in your struggles. The strangers I saw in church have now become my friends. I now sometimes stay and talk with them when I would just normally walk out right after church. It is amazing how one seemingly fairly uneventful weekend can change your life. CRHP women help other women. Recently I have been struggling with a colicky baby. The CRHP women bravely volunteered to sign up certain evenings to come and help care for him to give my husband and me a break. What a lifesaver they have been! They have volunteered their time and energy to come to a house they had never been to before and care for a baby they had never met with no thought of any repayment. How incredible! These are the women who show Gods love and light to others by their actions. They are blessings from above and I feel so blessed that I am one of their CRHP sisters. I can only hope to have the opportunity to repay them someday or at least spread love to others like they have done for me.

PRINCIPAL RESIGNATION: As your pastor and the local superintendent of Saint Anthony School, I want to provide you with clarification and direction during this time of unexpected transition at our school. When I received Mrs. Schimmoeller's letter of resignation effective October 16 (end of the first quarter), I shared the shock that many of you felt. I like Mrs. Schimmoeller very much. She is a great spiritual and educational leader. I think that the life skills program, the morning and end-of-day prayers in the gym were important innovations, and greatly strengthened our Catholic identity. I think that we made strides in improving our academic performance. I think she hired excellent persons to replace the teachers we lost. I was looking forward to working with her on the process of raising teachers' pay and finding the way to pay for these raises. Please disregard the rumors that say that I fired Mrs. Schimmoeller.

Where will we go from here? We will work with the Catholic Education Department of the Diocese to come up with the best solution to fit our school and community. One – and possibly two – candidates have surfaced. We will have to come up with a strategy to fit our short-term and long-term needs. When we have established a clear path, I will be in touch with you regarding the next steps. We will also determine the best route to take in the hiring process with the interview process being a team approach. We want the transition to be as smooth as possible for our students, families, and staff.

It has also become clear that St. Anthony Parish and School suffer from a lack of coordination between the Parish, Finance and School Committees. We will need to explore ways to get these committees working and talking with a unified voice.

A lot of us are going to have to examine our consciences (myself included) and ask ourselves how we could have been more supportive, and how we will ask God to help us reform our attitudes and words of non-support when we deal with the next principal.

I want to thank all parishioners for your support of Saint Anthony School with gifts of time, talent and treasure. Saint Anthony offers an education that based in the Catholic faith, where we not only learn catechism facts, but why Mass is important (and how to act like it's important), where acceptance of the child who is different is demanded, and where we uphold and model the beauty of Christian marriage. As we make decisions, I will write about them in my bulletin column. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to see me or e-mail me.


