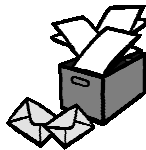

A Note from Fr. Tom

EVICTING THE ENEMY IN THE GATES (part 2): *(This is the condensed version of the conclusion of an article by Greg Schlueter, president of a Catholic organization called Mass Impact.)* What do men and women need to understand about porn? What women need to understand is that vulnerability to porn has nothing to do with how much men love their wives. It has nothing to do with men’s earnest desire to be holy. God placed in each of us a relentless desire for completion that can only be found in Himself, and He linked this to the completeness that men and women find in marriage. That makes people vulnerable to porn, readily available but a poor counterfeit for marriage.

What women need to understand is that real men really want to win the battle with porn. When they do fall, it is nearly impossible for their wives not to take it personally. Women have to insist on accountability for the men in their lives; yet they need to go to battle for them and sacrificially pray for them.

What men need to know is that porn is an occasion of mortal sin, and it is paving the way to hell. Porn is sexual involvement with other women. It is adultery. (Matt. 5:28) Satan is there. As Jesus suggests, it’s not even just the physical engagement. It’s your imagination. Your soul is in danger. You need real help. You cannot conquer on your own.

What men need to know is that regardless of how far you’ve fallen, or how helpless you feel after so many attempts, Saint Paul still hits the nail on the head for you: you can make yourself a living sacrifice. You can conform no longer to the ways of this world. You can be transformed inwardly by the renewal of the Spirit, and that includes your inner world of imagination, thought and feeling. You can live in the abundance of God’s good, pleasing and perfect will. (Romans 12:1-2)

OK, so where do you begin? Start by deciding. For real. Not kind-of-sort-of. Because God made you for greater things. Because your spouse and family need you. Because in Christ we are more than conquerors. It is time to take action by closing the door on Internet porn. Make your declaration to the Lord. Engage a good priest or brother whom you trust. Fully confess. Repent with all your heart. Renounce the Enemy in the name of Jesus Christ. Receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Back it up with real commitment.

“[The Devil] attacks the family so much. That demon does not love it and seeks to destroy it. [...] May the Lord bless the family. May He make it strong in this crisis, in which the devil wishes to destroy it.” – Pope Francis
Parents, especially dads, regardless of how much control you think you have over media consumption, don’t presume. Have the courage to sit down with your children and ask up-front: “Have you struggled with porn?”

Convey to them that you get it: that God designed them for great intimacy; that the Enemy would rob them of it. Acknowledge that it is attractive. You’re on their side. They can come to you. You’re going to battle for them. You’ll work with them so that they can receive all God desires for them. Right there pray with them and bless them. “[T]he Devil is at work. But I would like to say in a loud voice ‘God is stronger.’ Do you believe this, that God is stronger?”

In our home we’ve enlisted in the battle. We’re committing in two ways. Please join us. First, [Catholic Covenant Eyes](#) is installed on all our devices and computers. It’s the best recommended solution by every Catholic leader I know. Check out their website, www.covenanteyes.com. Resist the Devil who whispers in your ear, “You and your loved ones are just fine. You’re different. You don’t need it.” He doesn’t want that door closed. This is your battle right now.

Secondly, my sons and I decided that we’re going to give up meat on Fridays for the specific, sacrificial purpose of defending and honoring God’s design for women, and to live fully our call as men. Join us.
