A Note from Fr. Tom

PURGATORY 101: If we held a contest for Most Popular Catholic Doctrine, Purgatory might come in last. People wonder why, if Jesus saved us from our sins, do many, or most people have to suffer punishment on their way to heaven. First of all, that is not a totally fair description of what Purgatory is. Purgatory is more like a loving final clean-up that God gives us in order that we may be worthy of entering His presence. Yes, God gives us His friendship through the blood of Jesus Christ. Yes, God welcomes us into His family at our baptism. Yes, we're truly forgiven in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

But yes as well, we have sinful habits that cling to us. Even the best of us might find one sin or another attractive. All that needs to be cleansed before we can totally enjoy the vision and the friendship of the all-holy, all-loving God. Think of it this way: in heaven, you will be beholding the beauty of the triune God, the Creator of our universe of 10 trillion galaxies and **100 octillion stars**. Take the mountain-devouring fire that enveloped Moses at Sinai, the storm-cloud that bellowed at Job, and the glowing, lightning-flecked cloud spied by the prophet Ezekiel, roll them all into one, and you will still fall short of what the beatific vision will be like. As fantastic as their visions were, none of these holy men beheld God directly in this life. And yet we will behold Him in heaven. Who wouldn't want one more round of purification before that?

Is Purgatory in the Bible? Perhaps the word "purgatory" isn't there. But there are some solid indications that it's a Biblical teaching. The classic text is 2nd Maccabees 12: 43-46, which talks about the need to pray for the dead so that they may be freed from their sins. And then there's 1st Corinthians 3: 11-15. Saint Paul says that Jesus Christ is the rock-solid foundation of each of our spiritual lives. But then he asks how we have been building on that foundation. Have we been building our spiritual life with gold and precious stones? Have we been building with sticks and straw? Saint Paul says that God will try our work with fire. "If someone's work is burned up, that one will suffer loss; the person will be saved, but only as through fire."

So don't think of Purgatory as God's payback time. Think of it as God's gift of final purification of whatever stain of sin remains with us at the moment of our death. Could this purification be painful? Change for the better is always painful. On earth, we sometimes give up on the change process and fail, but in Purgatory there is no failure. The grace of God sees us through it. Can we help the dead with their purification process? Somehow our prayers do help. There are epitaphs from the earliest centuries asking that passers-by pray for the person whose body is in the grave. I don't think that any Church writer has tried to explain exactly how this works, but we ask God to help someone we love to be open to God's purifying work. All Souls Day, November 2 is specially dedicated to this type of prayer, as is the entire month of November.

That's why we have today's (Sunday's) devotion at 2 p.m. Within Vespers and Benediction, we will mention by name all those buried from Saint Anthony's in the last twelve months, and of course pray for all our relatives and friends who have gone before us. I hope that you will join us in this important tradition of prayer.

RELIGIOUS VOCATIONS 101: The Bishops of Ohio have asked Catholics around the state to keep a special day of prayer for an increase in vocations to the priesthood, diaconate and religious life. Our parish is one of those where a holy hour will take place. That's **this Wednesday, November 4 at 7 p.m.** (Sorry for the confusion in last week's bulletin over the day of the week.) In our Life Teen, our grade school and our CCD, we have some of the finest young people I have ever met. Their parents' strong faith and high ideals have made them that way. Their teachers and youth leaders have played a crucial part in their formation. And I am convinced that God in His subtle way is calling some of these young people to special service in His Church. How is it then that neither a priest nor a Sister has come from Saint Anthony in almost sixty years? I have no answer; I see no solution except prayer. So I am inviting everyone to a prayer service in union with Bishop Thomas and the other Bishops of Ohio, here at our parish on Wednesday at 7 p.m.
