A Note from Fr. Tom

ELDER VICTIMIZATION PREVENTION TRAINING: Elder abuse is real, but it's not always easy to detect. A training program is being offered without cost next Saturday, November 14, from 8:30 am to noon, in Sts. Peter & Paul School Cafeteria. A light breakfast will be served starting at 8:30. At 9:00 am, Crime Victim Services and Putnam County Adult Protective Services will train participants on the red flags of elder abuse. At 10:00 am, Stephen Jenkins, LSW, from Crime Victim Services Putnam County, will train participants on financial exploitation. At 11:00 am, Mediator Amy Wiechart-Bayliff will explain the role of mediation and will offer participants skills to help initiate discussions on difficult family circumstances and decisions. Pre-registration is not required Stephen Jenkins, 419-523-1111 but will help in planning. Call or email sjenkins@crimevictimservices.org. I would especially recommend this training to people who take Holy Communion to shut-ins, but it will be valuable to anyone who works with the elderly.

SOME SPECIAL COLLECTIONS: Some special needs have come up for which we need to ask your financial help: 1. A family in this parish is struggling with illness, and with the main breadwinner being unable to work. The ushers will pass the basket a second time next Lord's Day, November 14-15. 2. The Committee for the Future of the School is asking that we place envelopes in the pews to help with a Christmas bonus for the teachers and school staff. The parish traditionally does give a Christmas bonus, varying in size, depending on our financial status in November-December. However, as a sign of support from the parishioners, we would like to hold a collection to supplement what the parish might give this year. 3. On Thanksgiving Day we traditionally take up a collection for The Lord's Pantry. Every year we try to give between \$1000 and \$1500. We trust in your generosity to make this happen. 4. There are two second-collection envelopes in your regular pack. The first is for the Campaign for Human Development, by which the US Bishops fund programs that give poor people a start on making their own way out of poverty. The second is for pensions for retired Religious. For many years, Sisters in schools, hospitals etc. worked for a pittance. I've learned that the Sylvania Franciscans who taught me in the 1950s and 60s were receiving \$35 per Sister per month. The assumption was that there would always be younger Sisters to support the retirees, and nothing was saved for pensions. Now there is an un-funded liability amounting to billions of dollars nation-wide. Any of us who went to Catholic school "back in the day", got admitted to St. Rita Hospital, etc. are the beneficiaries of the ministry done by Sisters who are now retired. We owe them.

THANKSGIVING CELEBRATIONS: The Ecumenical Thanksgiving Service will take place on Sunday, November 22 at 7 p.m. at St. John United Methodist. Our own Thanksgiving Mass will take place here on Thursday, November 26 at 9:00 a.m. It is really important to show our gratitude to God for His many blessings. We need never to imagine that we have created our own blessings, or to imagine that we don't have to be a blessing for people who have none.

WORLD MEETING OF FAMILIES – FOLLOW-UP DEANERY EVENT: There will be a follow-up gathering for our deanery to bring home the World Meeting of Families to us. It will take place **at Kalida this Wednesday at 7 p.m.,** with a reception to follow.
