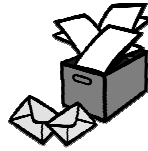

# A Note from Fr. Tom

**MONEY QUESTIONS:** Some people have asked how we handle incoming money and account for expenses at Saint Anthony. The Diocese of Toledo has set up a system of checks and balances to promote honesty and transparency, and we try to follow that system in the best way we can.

On the income side, this is what happens: A team of money-counters opens the envelopes, writes the amount of the donation on the face of the envelope, and counts the cash and checks. They also count the loose collection. Money counters are not supposed to work alone. Their partners are frequently rotated; they rarely work with the same person twice. They write out a detailed report form for Marilyn, as well as a deposit slip for the bank. They then place the money in the bank's night depository. On Monday morning, Marilyn goes to the bank and works with a teller to verify the amount of the deposit. Marilyn then records the contributions that the money counters have listed on the faces of the envelopes, and verifies that the total on the envelopes equals the total on the report form and the deposit slip. Envelopes are then stored in the rectory basement for five years, in case they may be needed for a diocesan audit. After five years they are shredded.

What happens when the parish receives a bill? Unless it is something very routine (like a utility bill), Fr. Tom either approves an invoice for payment or questions it. Mr. Hummel does the same for bills that are received at the school. Marilyn then writes a check, which Fr. Tom signs. (Marilyn is the only other signer of our checks, but she signs checks only if Fr. Tom is absent, and will not be available soon.) Our bookkeeping program automatically posts the check to our ledger. When the bank sends our monthly statement, Fr. Tom reads it closely, and then goes over any unclear items with Marilyn. Marilyn then reconciles our account to the bank statement.

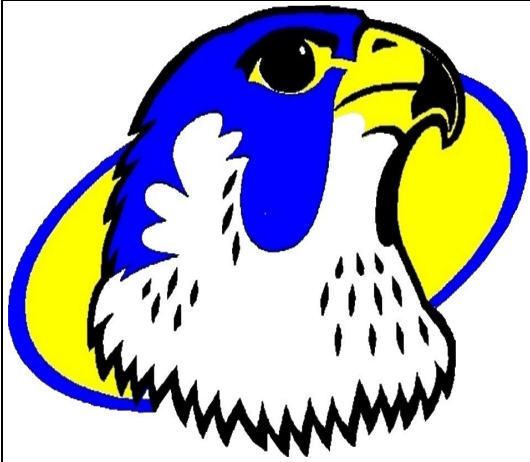
At the beginning of each fiscal year, a team from the Finance Committee audits the parish's records. All records that are entered into the computer are stored off-site (that's what "cloud computing" means); the Diocese is able to continuously monitor the income and expenses of each parish. It should be noted that the Finance Committee is an advisory body; final authority on financial matters rests with the pastor. It will happen occasionally that a pastor and finance committee will disagree. However, I believe that it is a sign of a serious problem if the pastor, the principal and the finance committee are in a state of perpetual disagreement. I am happy to report that that is not the case here; we've been able to work out the few conflicts we have had, and then we've moved forward to work for the good of the parish.

**ENDOWMENT:** The parish has a savings account and two endowments. The cemetery endowment is still quite small, no more than \$5100. The school endowment is The savings and the two endowments are invested in a pooled account with the Diocese, which then places the money with professional money managers. We have a choice of six different mutual funds that these money managers offer, ranging from a money market fund to an aggressive growth fund. I am a coward when it comes to investing other people's money, and so our money is in a conservative stock-and-bond fund that yields about 5%.

We can withdraw from the savings account at any time. The endowments are a different story. We cannot use the principal in the endowments; we receive a quarterly check for interest and dividends. The only way we could get at the principal would be to receive a unanimous vote of the Parish Council and the Finance Committee, plus permission of the Bishop. A savings account is for emergency needs. An endowment is to provide a perpetual income stream to a parish or school. At another parish a couple told me that they were putting the school endowment in their will. They bequeathed an amount that would be large enough to yield their annual offering every year, even after they both passed away.

**BUSINESS MANAGER:** I don't think I ever spelled out what Harold Gerten's role is as business manager. Harold does not handle money or make personnel decisions. He researches major purchases to make sure that the parish is receiving the best price for equal quality. Things he has worked on include the low-wattage lighting in our church, paid for in large part by a grant from AEP; new tires for the parish pick-up truck; and contracts with electric and natural gas utilities at favorable rates. He has also obtained the services of parish volunteers for improvements in parking-lot lighting and the grading and seeding of our new property. He will probably be the person who handles bids for our tie-in to the new town sanitary sewer. Could I have done these things myself? Probably yes (except for the utility contracts), but Harold has freed me to concentrate more on the things I was ordained to do.
