
"THAT MAN IS YOU", SECOND SEMESTER: The first semester of "That Man Is You" is almost over. About forty men have been gathering at 6 a.m. on Saturday mornings to discuss the leadership role of Catholic men in their families, their parish and their community. The second semester will begin in January and continue for thirteen weeks with a break at Easter. Watch for registration forms that will be in the pews soon, and for further explanations in the bulletin. Men who did not register for the first semester are welcome to take part in the second semester.

CEMETERY CRUCIFIX: The finish has been peeling off our cemetery crucifix, no doubt because it has been exposed to the weather for years. It has been taken to a workshop to be evaluated. When a plan of action to restore it is determined, and when we learn the proposed cost, you will be informed. It is too soon to say when the project will be completed. It depends on the type of the work to be done, and to a certain extent even on the winter weather. If anyone understands Ohio weather and knows what is coming, I would like to meet you and shake your hand.

THANKS TO ALL: I would like to write a note of thanks to everyone who helped with Purse Bingo and with the Feather Party. Purse Bingo was extremely well attended and everyone seemed to be having a good time. It took a lot of planning and organizing, a lot of work at the event itself, and clean-up lasted into very late hours. The profit for our school was over \$14,000. It will be used carefully on projects that we might not otherwise be able to afford. Another large crowd assembled for the Feather Party and enjoyed raffles, breakfast and a bake sale. The profit of the Feather Party was \$3,332.00. Again, we are grateful for numerous workers, for the merchants who donated prizes, for all who donated baked goods, and for those who set up and cleaned up. By the way, why is it called a feather party? Because in my mom and dad's day, the prizes were live chickens, ducks, geese and turkeys. If you were a winner back then, your work was cut out for you when you got home.

GOD WHO IS, WHO WAS AND WHO IS TO COME: People usually think of Advent as preparation to celebrate Jesus' first coming at Christmas. It is that, but Advent also looks forward to Jesus' second coming at the end of time. We pay too little attention to that doctrine, although in the Creed we say "...from thence He will come to judge the living and the dead." He made the Church holy, but for the time being it is in an imperfect state of holiness, and needs a final victory over evil. The world is not yet subject to Jesus, and struggles against Him. The Catechism of the Catholic Church points out that there will be a final unleashing of the powers of evil, which will lead to Jesus coming as judge. Jesus will judge His enemies and His friends. Some will hear "Depart from me, you evildoers..."; others will hear "Come, you who are blessed by my Father."

By dying on the cross, Jesus acquired the right to judge us. His desire is to save us and to give us the life that He has in Himself. If we reject His cross – if we think that the life of grace that He won for us is unimportant, we have already judged ourselves. We don't know when Judgment Day is coming. The important thing is not to calculate the day and year of His coming but to "be vigilant at all times," as we hear today in Saint Luke's Gospel. That means to spend time in prayer every day focused on the presence of Jesus in our world, and then to acknowledge Him in the people we meet who need our help.
