

A Note from Fr. Tom

MERRY CHRISTMAS: A few years ago, Pope Benedict XVI had this to say at Midnight Mass: "God's sign is his humility. God's sign is that he makes himself small; he becomes a child; he lets us touch him and he asks for our love. How we would prefer a different sign, an imposing, irresistible sign of God's power and greatness! But his sign summons us to faith and love, and thus it gives us hope: this is what God is like. He has power, he is Goodness itself. He invites us to become like him. Yes indeed, we become like God if we allow ourselves to be shaped by this sign; if we ourselves learn humility and hence true greatness; if we renounce violence and use only the weapons of truth and love."

We aren't celebrating the birth of a mighty emperor, of someone who strikes us with fear. The power of mighty emperors lasts only for a time. When they die, their power becomes a tale in a dusty book. Some people are glad to be rid of them. Jesus comes to welcome us into the true Kingdom. On the feast of Christ the King, the Church describes this Kingdom as "a kingdom of truth and grace, a kingdom of justice, love and peace." My wish for all of us in the New Year is that we will find happiness as we live the life of that Kingdom.

FEAST OF THE HOLY FAMILY: Our Church calendar is centered on two great feasts: Christmas and Easter. Each of these has a season of preparation (Advent and Lent). After each of these, we celebrate some less important feasts that help us reflect more deeply on the great feasts. The Feast of the Holy Family, the Sunday after Christmas is one of these. Pope Pius XI started this celebration in the 1920s because he thought family life was threatened. What would he say if he saw the condition of family life today? In our century, Pope Francis called representatives of the world's bishops together for a synod on the family. They gave him a report that began with what the Bible has to say about marriage and families, stressing that the Church needs to continue teaching the need for committed, fruitful and life-long relationships between one man and one woman, that this relationship is the best "school for life" for children, and that the dioceses of the world need to find more creative ways to teach this good news.

The response of our Diocese has been a two-day marriage preparation program called "Joy-Filled Marriage." It has been run as a pilot program in a few locations, and is now ready to be implemented. It will be presented eight times in Putnam County in 2016, and is also scheduled in Paulding, Lima, Delphos and Bowling Green. Further information is available at www.jfmtoledo.eventbrite.com.

MARY, MOTHER OF GOD: Another feast to help us understand Christmas better is this Friday, January 1, called "Mary, Mother of God." It's a holy day of obligation. The feast goes back to the Third Ecumenical Council which was held at Ephesus in the summer of 431. It was part of the discussion (often bitter) about just who Jesus was. People all over the Church were spouting off heretical opinions, including the opinion that Mary was the mother of Jesus' human nature, but not of His divine nature. The Council of Ephesus said that there is not a divided Jesus, but that Jesus is a divine Person Who has taken on a human nature. He loses nothing of His divinity by doing so, and His humanity is not lost within His divinity. Since Jesus is a divine Person, Mary is to be called "Mother of God." In this title we can understand God's extreme generosity in becoming one of us. There are no half-measures with God!
