Thomas as Apostolic Administrator of the Diocese of Cleveland in addition to his responsibilities as the Bishop of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Toledo. This appointment accompanied Pope Francis' acceptance of the resignation of the Most Reverend Richard G. Lennon for health reasons. Bishop Thomas has served as the Bishop of Toledo since 22 October 2014 and will continue in this office as he also serves the Diocese of Cleveland.

HAPPY NEW YEAR! It isn't every year that we put out a bulletin on New Year's Day. I want to take this opportunity to thank everyone for all their kindnesses in the old year. I hope that this will be a new year of living and spreading our faith in Jesus Christ. I want to thank you as well for your generosity in the Christmas collection, and for the personal gifts that you sent me. I appreciate each one of them.

DEATH PENALTY: A change that the New Year is bringing us is a reinstatement of the death penalty in Ohio. A man name Ronald Phillips is scheduled to be executed on January 12. Bishop Thomas and the other Bishops of Ohio are urging the abolition of the death penalty in our state. The following are the reasons: 1. The death penalty is not evenly applied to convicted persons of every race and economic background. 2. The death penalty ends all chance of repentance before God. 3. With all the appeals, the death penalty is very expensive to the State of Ohio. It is actually cheaper to lock up a criminal for life with no opportunity for parole than to pay for all the appeals of a death sentence. 4. It has happened more often than we would dare to think that an innocent person has been executed. If this were to happen only once, it would be too often. If a convicted person is proven innocent, the courts can reverse his or her prison sentence; the death penalty is irreversible.

Pope St. John II, Pope Benedict XVI, and now Pope Francis have spoken out against the death penalty. Last March 20, Pope Francis said, "Today the death penalty is inadmissible, no matter how serious the crime committed. It is an offense against the inviolability of life and the dignity of the human person, one which contradicts God's plan for man and society and his merciful justice, and impedes the penalty from fulfilling any just objective. It does not render justice to the victims, but rather fosters vengeance."

Archbishop Joseph Naumann of Kansas City KS, whose own father was murdered, said: "Our refusal to resort to the death penalty is not because we fail to appreciate the horror of the crime committed, but because we refuse to imitate violent criminals."

SPEAKING OF THE BISHOP: By now everyone knows that Bishop Thomas is now serving both as Bishop of Toledo and as temporary administrator of the Diocese of Cleveland. I'm sure that the Cleveland position is much more complex than Toledo. This temporary change will probably make little difference to us in Columbus Grove, except that there may be a slow-down in paper work that comes from the Bishop's Office. My great concern would be for the Bishop's health as he tries to perform two jobs adequately, and for his safety in travel, especially over a snow-covered Ohio Turnpike. Please remember him in your prayers.

"SEVEN DEADLY SINS, SEVEN LIVELY VIRTUES" will be our adult retreat/ education program for Lent this year. A registration form will be in next week's bulletin. We will start at 7 p.m. on Monday, January 30 and go for seven weeks. I am hoping that we can end at 8:00 p.m. each evening or shortly afterward. We are starting early so as to be done before the farming season starts. If the stores start Christmas in August, St. Anthony's can start Lent in January! I think that this program will deepen our understanding of Christian morality, it will give us deeper insight as we prepare for Confession, and it will enable parents and grandparents to be more effective spiritual leaders of their families.
