HOLIDAY CONFUSION: Let's see... if yesterday was Christmas, today must be Monday... no, no, it's Saturday... Well, isn't my sister's birthday on Saturday? No, no, that's next Saturday! All these major holidays make you forget what day of the week it is, where you're supposed to be and what you're supposed to do. (At least my sister claims that her birthday is a major holiday.) And for us fogies from Latin Mass days, it doesn't help that Epiphany is on January 3 instead of on the Twelfth Day of Christmas, which is January 6. Rather than add to the confusion, let's just go with the flow and celebrate Epiphany today.


The story of the Wise Men is only in St. Matthew. That's remarkable, because St. Matthew is the most Jewish of the four Gospels. He takes pains to show that Jesus is the Son of Abraham and Son of David. On numerous occasions he points out that something Jesus did fulfills a prophecy. He locates Jesus on the mountain, teaching the New Law, like Moses coming down the mountain with the tablets of the Old Law. But who are the first people to greet the Jewish Messiah? Foreigners! Men steeped in non-Jewish wisdom! People who lived far from the Holy Land! God has used their pagan wisdom to lead them to a little Child Who will be the Savior!

So Jesus is the Jewish Messiah, but He's not just for Jews. He's for the world. Matthew makes that clear when he recalls Jesus commanding the Apostles before He ascends into heaven: "Go forth and teach <u>all nations</u>...." He doesn't say, "Go forth and teach <u>this</u> nation" but "<u>all</u> nations." It's one more indication that Jesus' saving mission is for you and me, and that's why we celebrate.

THAT MAN IS YOU will begin its second semester on Saturday, January 16 at that wonderful hour, 6 a.m. Like the first semester, this semester will be 13 weeks long. There will be a break on Holy Saturday, March 26. If you registered for the first semester, you are already registered for the second semester. There will be no need for any further paper work. THANK YOU! THANK YOU! After Christmas Masses, we took about \$47,000 to the bank. That compares to \$40,000 at Christmas of 2014. After last summer's floods, I predicted that our festival profit and Christmas collection would suffer. Instead the festival declined only slightly, and the Christmas offering rose by 17.5%. I'm glad I'm a terrible prophet. Thank you for supporting the ministry of our parish and school in such an outstanding way. I might add that your gifts to our fund for parishioners with health emergencies came to about \$8000. That includes a \$5000 gift from a corporation, and about \$1600 that St. Anthony School students fund-raised to help a school family. The original plan was to help just one family, but we became aware of more health emergencies, and were able to help four families.
