

CATHOLIC SCHOOLS WEEK: Things were so different when I was a student in our parish school in Toledo. Tuition was \$5 a year (\$10 maximum for a family). All the teachers and the principal were Franciscan Sisters from Sylvania. The principal doubled as the full-time 2nd-grade teacher. Religion class consisted of reciting the catechism answers that you had memorized, unless one of the assistant pastors took the class – a break we dearly loved. There was no phone in the school. If the principal needed to call someone, she had to walk home to use the phone in the convent. We went to Mass in Latin every day. The hymns were in Polish, and sometimes we got in trouble for butchering the pronunciation. There were more than 50 kids in every classroom. Grades 1 and 2 had more than 80 kids; we were the beginning of the postwar baby boom. When the rooms were closed up tight during the winter, they smelled pretty funky by lunchtime. You had to be very careful on the playground, because even with that mob of kids running around, the big boys were allowed to play pass-and-tap football, and you could be trampled. If Sister called your mother about something bad you had done, you would get a second punishment, only worse. The pastor handed out report cards personally, and bawled kids out in front of the class if they got bad grades in religion, conduct or effort. And we wouldn't have dreamed of going to school anyplace else.

I think that the only thing that hasn't changed is the pass-and-tap football games, but they take place at the east end of the playground, so no one gets trampled. That and the fact that we had quality education in my day (how, with 80 kids in a room I'll never know), and we still do today. Just notice how many St. Anthony kids are on the honor roll at Columbus Grove High School. Just notice how many of our graduates we can really be proud of. Just notice that our young people in Grades K to 8 are already children to be proud of, because they've been given strong personal values to go with the education they received. The most important thing that hasn't changed is that Jesus Christ is still the unseen Teacher in every classroom. What can be more important than providing a setting where children can learn from Him?

LENT IS ALMOST HERE! In eleven days it will be Lent. We will fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, and abstain from meat on all other Fridays. We will have Stations of the Cross on Fridays at 1 p.m. There will be extra Confession times – more than usual, because of the Jubilee Year of Mercy. And there will be adult education. I believe in offering a parish mission or an educational series during Lent because such events are one more opportunity for adults to conform themselves to Christ. This year's series is a video series called "Unlocking the Mystery of the Bible." It will take place on Thursdays at 7 p.m. in our parish hall, starting February 11. 



Common Sense

"All this I have kept in mind and recognized: the just, the wise, and their deeds in the hand of God"

Ecclesiastes 9:1
