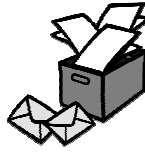

# A Note from Fr. Tom

**SPECIAL DIOCESAN MASS:** There will be a special Mass for parents who have experienced the pain of losing a baby (either miscarried, stillborn or dying soon after birth) on Wednesday, March 9 at 5:15 at St. Joseph in Tiffin. Father Joseph Szybka, the pastor will be the celebrant.

**ALTAR SERVER SAINT-TO-BE:** José Luis Sánchez del Rio was an altar server in Mexico during the 1920s. The government in Mexico at the time persecuted the Church; José Luis took part in the Cristero revolution against this government. He was arrested, tortured, placed before an open grave, and was threatened with shooting unless he shouted “Death to Christ the King.” Instead he shouted “Viva Cristo Rey” (Long live Christ the King), was killed instantly and tumbled into the grave. The final miracle for his canonization has just been approved, the unexplainable healing of a baby who was pronounced brain-dead after suffering a stroke. The canonization will be sometime later this year. I am hoping to get a picture or a statue for the altar servers’ sacristy as soon as I can find one. The baby is now about 7 years old. **LENT BEGINS:** Lent is early this year; Ash Wednesday is this Wednesday! We will distribute ashes at the 8:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. Masses. Other opportunities are as follows:

**Ecumenical Lenten Series:** The series is a cooperative effort between the churches of Columbus Grove and Vaughnsville. The series will be based on the parable of the Prodigal Son (how great is that for the Year of Mercy?). Each Wednesday there will be a luncheon at 11:30 with a Scripture service and homily to follow. The schedule is as follows: February 10, Presbyterian Church; February 17, St. Anthony; February 24, Church of the Good Shepherd; March 2, Christian Church; March 9, St. John United Methodist; and March 16, Vaughnsville Community Church.

**Unlocking the Mystery of the Bible:** The purpose of this video series is to help us understand the close unity between the two Testaments of the Bible and to show how our Catholic faith is founded in the Bible. We will meet on Thursdays (except Holy Thursday) in the parish hall at 7 p.m. We will start this Thursday, February 11.

**Stations of the Cross** will take place twice each Friday: at 1 p.m. for the school, and for those who don’t like to drive after dark; and at 7 p.m. for those who work during the day.

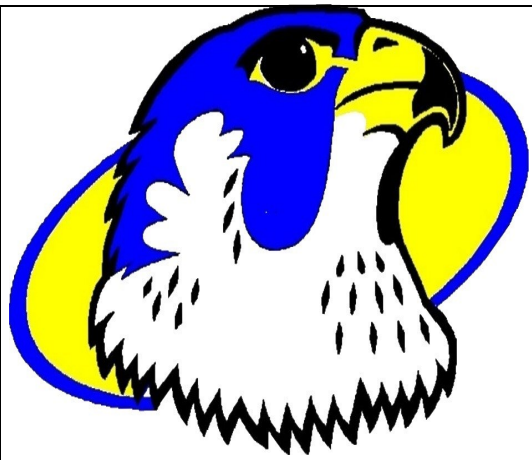
**24 Hours for the Lord:** Pope Francis has called for this to take place on Friday-Saturday, March 4-5. In our area, we are making this a deanery, not a one-parish effort. Our share of the 24 Hours is to offer Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and Confessions from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Saturday, March 5. Father Bill Pifher from Leipsic will help me hear Confessions part of that time. Somebody’s penance is going to be to go to Subway and get me a sandwich!

**The Light is On:** Motel 6 has left a light on for you; so will the Diocese of Toledo in its confessionals! On the following Wednesdays I will hear Confessions from 7 to 9 p.m.: March 2, 9, and 16. On the following Thursdays I will hear Confessions from noon until 2 p.m.: March 3, 10 and 17. This doesn’t exactly correspond to the schedule the Diocese recommended, but I don’t want to conflict with either the ecumenical series or the school’s lunch/recess schedule.

**MORE ON THE YEAR OF MERCY:** The Diocese wants homilies on the spiritual works of mercy on the first Lord’s Day of each month. We are beginning this week with “Admonishing the Sinner.” Sometime soon, the Diocese will propose activities to help us experience the corporal works of mercy.

**ANNUAL CATHOLIC APPEAL:** You heard the message asking our help with the Annual Catholic Appeal. I want everyone to know that I support this campaign totally. Back in the 1960s and 70s, people who gave to the appeal paid in part for my seminary education. Now when I give, I feel that I am paying it forward, and making sure that there will be a priest to succeed me 20 years from now. Whoever the pastor of St. Anthony will be in 2036, your donation is probably helping to pay for his education. I would also invite you to notice in the brochure from the Diocese, that they list items that the small donor can help with. \$1 buys a hot meal at a diocesan lunch program for a needy person. \$6 buys a Mass book for a child with autism.
