MASS FOR SHUT-INS and *CATHOLIC CHRONICLE* : Because of the present state of diocesan finances, the Mass for Shut-Ins and the *Catholic Chronicle* are being discontinued. In the letter from Bishop Thomas that we are making available to you, he spells out the reasons for taking these steps in detail. It appears that our locally produced Mass is duplicating a service that EWTN provides on Sundays at midnight, 8 a.m. and noon. Is there anyone in the parish who cannot receive EWTN? If so, please let me know and I will forward the information to the Bishop's office.

I began reading the *Catholic Chronicle* back in grade school, when it still had a Catholic comic page. I gradually moved on to more in-depth reading, and continued to look forward to its arrival right up to the present. While I didn't read every word, I found a large amount of helpful information in its pages. There are not too many places where you can get accurate information about the diocesan, national and worldwide Church. Many daily papers appoint religion editors who have no faith background; they frequently miss the point of what the Church is trying to do, and get side-tracked into some unimportant issue. And there are religion editors out there who are downright hostile toward the Catholic Church (as an example, the *New York Times* reported that "hundreds" of people marched in the recent March for Life in Washington DC).

For those who are interested in keeping up with the rest of the Catholic world, I would recommend a subscription to *Our Sunday Visitor* or the *National Catholic Register*. These are both rather conservative publications. For those who appreciate more coverage of social justice issues, I would recommend *America* magazine. If you want something that is free, you can get a daily newsletter e-mailed to you from <u>www.newadvent.org</u>. This website sometimes wastes your time with Catholic trivia, but there is a lot of spiritual food there. Give it a try and see what you think.

CONFESSION and PRAYER BEFORE THE BLESSED SACRAMENT: As part of the Year of Mercy, Bishop Thomas has asked us to offer extra Confessions during Lent. For "The Light Is On", I will place the Blessed Sacrament on the altar and then begin hearing Confessions. Times are 6 p.m. to 8 p.m. on Wednesdays, March 2, 9, 16 and 23; and from noon to 2 p.m. on Thursdays, March 3, 10, and 17. And Life Teen has asked for a penance service with Exposition today at 8:15 p.m. Extra priests from our area will be present at some of these times. Grade school students will come to Confession on the three Thursdays listed above, but there will be plenty of opportunity for everyone else.

Besides the request from the Bishop, there's a request from Pope Francis for "24 Hours with the Lord", consisting of Confession and prayer before the Blessed Sacrament. Our deanery is collaborating on this spiritual exercise. Our parish's share of "24 Hours with the Lord" will take place next Saturday beginning with Morning Prayer and Exposition at 8 a.m., and concluding with Benediction at 4 p.m. Confessions will be available through all this time. For part of the time, more than one priest will be available. And don't forget the traditional parish penance service on Monday, March 14 at 7 p.m.

If that's not enough, this Friday is First Friday. Our Lord will be present in the monstrance on the altar from about 8:45 until noon.

THE BOOK OF ESTHER, THE PRICE OF SILVER and DORITOS: Two Wednesdays ago, the reading at Mass was from the Book of Esther, which unfortunately happens only rarely. In this book, the evil Prime Minister Haman bribes the king of Persia with 10,000 pounds of silver to obtain permission to slaughter all the Jews in the kingdom. The Jewish Queen Esther, after intense prayer, is able to save the day. I asked the upper-grade students to calculate the present-day value of 10,000 pounds of silver, and promised a prize for accurate answers.
