ASSURING OUR SCHOOL'S FUTURE: Many of you were present at the 11:00 Mass on January 31 when we had the Mass for Catholic Schools Week. A good number also came to the open house afterward, toured the building, and met our principal, some of our teachers and our students. You saw and heard that we have a truly Catholic school, a school that prepares its young people for Catholic adulthood and for the jobs of the future, a school with faculty and administration that cooperates with parents in helping the next generation to grow in body, mind and spirit. The school and its teachers are partners to parents in helping to raise children to love and fear God, to know the Bible and the teachings of the Catholic Church, and eventually to enter adulthood with a distinctly Christian, Catholic world-view that strives to see the world as God sees it. Public schools are not able to do what we do, because public schools must serve all families, including non-Christian and non-believing families. Public schools cannot promote or favor any system of religious belief. We support our Catholic school because our school is free to do so much more in helping parents to guide their children in ways of faith.

This year, our tuition for one child is \$1060. Since we experienced a decline in enrollment, our per-pupil cost is \$5500. In effect, each child who walks in the door is getting a scholarship of \$4440. This level of support to the school from the parish is becoming harder to sustain. We offer the second lowest tuition in the Diocese of Toledo. Only St. Mary in Edgerton charges less, but then, their school is subsidized by three parishes: Edgerton, Blakeslee and Hicksville. To make a comparison closer to home, we charge \$600 less than Leipsic.

We also need to face the question of teachers' salaries. At the lower levels of seniority, our teachers' pay is much too low. If we had hired a full-time beginning teacher this year, we would have offered him or her \$22,500. This is about \$2400 above the Government's definition of poverty for a household of three persons. Many young people fresh out of college tell us that between rent, gasoline, groceries, and student loan payments, it is extremely difficult to make ends meet with an income of \$22,500. Most, if not all of our parents and grandparents would not like to see their son or daughter complete a college degree, get a professional license, and then be compensated at that level.

At the upper end of our pay scale, our teachers with the greatest seniority are making less money than a second-year teacher in the Columbus Grove public system. We have lost some very dedicated teachers over the years I have been here because they tell us that they simply need to make more money, and choose to apply at one of our area public schools. We would like to offer some significant pay increases to our teachers over the next three years. We cannot catch up with our local public school, but we can do better to properly recognize the gift that our teachers are to us, and to provide them with means to a decent living.

I am asking parishioners to increase the Sunday collection by \$612 per week. With more than 200 of us giving, I think we can reach this goal. So please consider not an immense raise, but a raise of two to ten dollars per week in your offering. If you are already "maxed out" in your offering, then I certainly would not ask you to harm your personal finances, but I would only say "God bless you for what you are already doing." If you are a regular envelope user who can give a few dollars more, I would ask you to help give our teachers some significant raises both this year and next. If you use your envelope only rarely or not at all, I would ask you to join the ranks of consistent givers.


We are also going to ask school parents to do their share by raising tuition to \$1240 per child, with discounts for the second, third or fourth child in a family. If this is too much of a burden for a family, please know that scholarship money is available through our Guardian Angel Fund. Scholarships are kept strictly confidential. Only Mr. Hummel, Mrs. Lori Giesige, our school secretary and I know who is receiving a scholarship. (Mrs. Giesige has to be informed, because she does the actual billing and collection of tuition monies.) I should also note that the Guardian Angel Fund can also use donations from parishioners who want to help make scholarships available for families who are experiencing financial difficulty.

We have a wonderful school at Saint Anthony, with dedicated teachers, administrators and staff. We are blessed with children who are eager to learn. This has been our gift for over one hundred years; let's make sure that future children have this gift until our 150th anniversary, our 200th anniversary and beyond.

At all these times we will have Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, so please stop in and pray even if you are planning to go to Confession at a different time.
