The Novena to The Divine Mercy In the Diary of St Faustina, we can read some of the following excerpts of what Jesus told St Faustina about the Novena, "The Lord told me to say this Chaplet for nine days before the Feast of Mercy. It is to begin on Good Friday."

"By this Novena, I will grant every possible grace to souls." Jesus is commanding me to make a Novena before the Feast of Mercy, and today I am to begin it for the conversion of the whole world and for the recognition of the Divine Mercy... so that every soul will praise My goodness. I desire trust from My creatures, Encourage souls to place great trust in My fathomless mercy. Let the weak, sinful soul have no fear to approach Me, for even if it had more sins that there are grains of sand in the world, all would be drowned in the immeasurable depths of My mercy." (The bold words are the words of our Lord to St Faustina.)

Our Lord gave St Faustina an intention to pray on each day of the Novena. It is greatly recommended that the Novena intentions and prayers be said together with the Chaplet of Divine Mercy. The Novena starts on Good Friday, March 25th and ends April 2nd, the day before Divine Mercy Sunday. SAVE THE DATE: I've made reservations for a parish pilgrimage on <u>Sunday</u>, <u>June 26</u> to Our Lady of Consolation in Carey as part of our parish's observance of the Jubilee Year of Mercy. _We will leave our parking lot soon after the 11 a.m. Mass, and return at about 6 p.m. If we go by bus, the fare will be about \$10 per person. If we car-pool, the cost will be up to you. Sunday dinner at the shrine cafeteria will be about \$10.50 per person; a lighter meal will cost about \$7.50. Picnicking is available in the shrine park. Pope Francis has made the same spiritual benefits available at local diocesan shrines as one would gain from a pilgrimage to Rome. I'm looking forward to going.

PARISH SURVEYS: Members of our parish council are hard at work compiling the results of our parish survey. Even with the use of computers, this is a major task. But we are glad so many people responded, because we can be sure that we have a fair sampling of parish opinion. A report summarizing the survey is coming soon.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS: On Holy Thursday at 8 a.m., Stations of the Cross will take place, led by our upper-grade students.

HOLY WEEK IS HERE: After forty days of prayer, fasting and works of mercy, we have reached the most important week of the Church calendar. Today we remember Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem with a special procession from the vestibule. (It's a little too cold to start a procession outdoors today.) Then we immediately fast-forward to Jesus' passion and death – this year, as told to us by St. Luke. Luke's Gospel is the Gospel of mercy. It is especially appropriate in this Year of Mercy to reflect on how Jesus forgave His executioners, and how He welcomed the repentant thief into paradise.

The Mass of the Lord's Supper is on <u>Holy Thursday</u>, <u>March 24 at 7 p.m.</u> This Mass recalls Jesus' gift of Himself in the Eucharist, the institution of the priesthood, and the command the Lord gave at the Last Supper to love one another. The procession with the Holy Eucharist at the end of Mass emphasizes Jesus' real presence. The 2nd and 3rd graders of both the parish school and the CCD program have been invited to take part in this procession. The foot-washing, in imitation of Jesus' action at the Last Supper, reminds us of the command to serve one another humbly.

On <u>Good Friday</u>, <u>March 25 at 1 p.m.</u>, we will celebrate the Liturgy of the Lord's Suffering and Death. Following a tradition that goes back to the earliest centuries, the Church holds a prayer service with reception of Holy Communion. Its high points are the entry in stark silence, the reading of the Passion according to John, petitions that are much more solemn than usual, the adoration of the cross, and Holy Communion with Hosts that were consecrated on Holy Thursday.

We spend <u>Holy Saturday</u>, <u>March 26</u> in silence, mourning the death of the Lord Who lies in the tomb, but hoping in the resurrection that He promised. At 8:30 p.m. when it is dark, we will gather either outside or in the vestibule, depending on the weather. The Easter Candle is lit and we enter the dark church, lighting the people's candles as we go. The pinpoints of light in the dark church are a symbol of the light of Christ's resurrection breaking into our dark world. An ancient hymn proclaims Jesus' victory; the Bible is read extensively; Easter water is blessed, and we celebrate the first Mass of Easter. Easter Sunday morning Masses follow at the usual times, 8:30 a.m. and 11 a.m.
