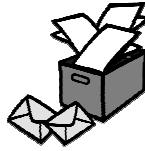

A Note from Fr. Tom

THANK YOU! THANK YOU! We've had a number of really outstanding collections this month. Our Easter collection is now over \$33,000. It's approaching last year's total, even after farm prices have fallen so much. The collection for "Pennies for Heaven", the Knights of Columbus fund for seminarians' support, brought in \$1110. Thank you for your generosity. I'd also like to note that we received enough in the Easter flower fund (about \$1980) that we will be able to keep the church decorated throughout the Easter season, as we are supposed to. I've ordered flowers for Confirmation, First Communion, Ascension (which is also Mother's Day), and Pentecost (which is also the day of the Mass for the high-school graduates.) And in addition, we received about \$1000 in the Good Friday collection for the Holy Land, and about \$1100 in the Rice Bowls, which is used for world hunger.

ANNUAL CATHOLIC APPEAL: More good news! We have gone over our goal for the Annual Catholic Appeal. Our goal is \$13,000; parishioners have given or pledged \$13,264. The \$264 (and any subsequent donations) will be rebated to the parish, to be used as we see fit.

Thanks to ACA, the Diocese has a skilled staff member in place who is available to us at no charge whenever we have personnel questions, an area of law that is changing all the time. Our school receives many free services from the Catholic Schools Office; their help was vital when we were having problems a year ago. And if we ever need legal advice, the diocesan attorney is ready to help us at no charge – all thanks to your Annual Catholic Appeal donation. Donations of all sizes are needed and appreciated. And remember, when you give you are probably paying seminary tuition for a future pastor of Saint Anthony.

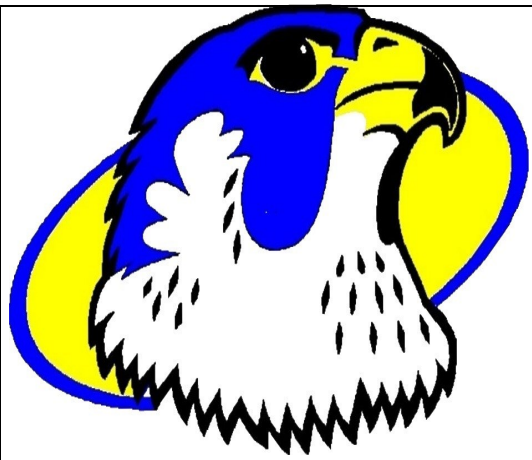
BISHOP'S STATEMENT ON POPE'S LETTER ABOUT MARRIAGE: *A worldwide Synod of Bishops met in Rome in Fall 2014 and Fall 2015 to discuss the topic of marriage. After a Synod, the Pope writes a summary statement. The letter from the Pope was released last Friday. I do not know if it is available in English yet or not. There has been a lot of speculation about what the Pope might say; Bishop Thomas is assuring us that no doctrine changed, and that the Pope spoke very positively about marriage. Here is a statement from Bishop Thomas explaining the Pope's letter:*

"In his apostolic exhortation, *Amoris Laetitia* (The Joy of Love), [released today](#), Pope Francis offers pastoral guidance for the Church in addressing the concrete realities of marriage and family life in the contemporary world. This document continues the dialogue of the two recent synods that took place in Rome in October 2014 and October 2015. As the title of this exhortation suggests, Pope Francis believes the Catholic Church can do more to assist families in rediscovering joy and hope in family life. The Holy Father encourages us not to allow fragile, complex or irregular situations to steal the joy that perseverance in faithful, generous and life-giving love brings to the world in a powerful way.

"*Amoris Laetitia* signals no change in Church teaching on sensitive and controversial matters, such as divorced and remarried Catholics and same-sex unions. Pope Francis calls all in the Church to a culture of encounter and accompaniment. The Holy Father desires all of us to rediscover the beauty of living the teachings of Jesus that show us the path to true love and true joy. He calls us neither to condemn nor condone, but instead to meet people where they are, no matter the situation, and draw them into the transforming love of Christ. This document is all the more significant when read through the lens of this Jubilee Year of Mercy, a year which proclaims not anything goes, but anything forgiven. I hope and pray that anyone who feels estranged or confused by the Church's teaching will seek the care and assistance of our local pastors, and encounter the mercy and healing of Jesus.

"In the introduction to his exhortation, Pope Francis encourages us to read *Amoris Laetitia* patiently and carefully in order to avoid a "rushed reading of the text" (AL #7). We look forward to the fruit that the study of this document will bring to the lives of the families of our Diocese. This document on love in the family reawakens in our hearts joy-filled memories of our diocesan pilgrimage to the World Meeting of Families during Pope Francis' historic visit to the United States this past September. I am encouraged by the vibrant Catholic family life I see here in the Diocese of Toledo, and I invite us all to continue to foster holy disciples, holy families and holy vocations to become a Holy Diocese of Toledo."
