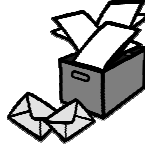

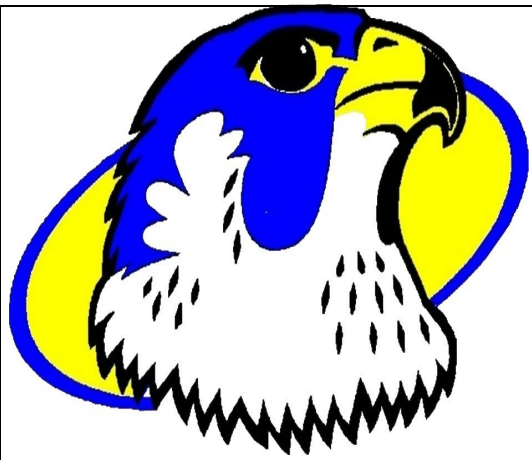
**PARISH COUNCIL:** The Parish Council has begun to work its way through the survey forms that 431 parishioners completed. The next step will be to come up with action items. We want everyone to know that we take your input seriously.

**WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR VOCATIONS:** The last several Holy Fathers have proclaimed a World Day of Prayer for Vocations on the Sunday when we read Jesus' description of Himself as the Good Shepherd. Let's all make a special effort to pray for priests and sisters who ministered to us throughout our lives – both the living and the dead. Let's pray for more young men and women in our diocese to respond to God's call. And pray for the priest you have right now.

Can we encourage our young people to consider priesthood, sisterhood, or brotherhood? It's definitely counter-cultural. People measure success in financial terms. "What will my daughter's salary be, or my son's net worth?" they ask. Or they want to know that their son will pass the family name on. Or they are concerned with the scandals we went through in recent years. Or they wonder what their neighbors and co-workers will say if their son or daughter makes such a choice. I don't want to attempt to answer these arguments point by point. After all, it all comes down to faith. Either you believe that we aren't measured by our money, or you do. Either you believe that sacraments are important or you don't. Either you believe in the guiding, protecting hand of Jesus Christ or you don't. Either you believe that our membership in the Body of Christ means that sometimes we need to make sacrifices, or you can assume that it's ok to let someone else take care of that.

I believe that I got a good education in the seminary at St. Meinrad; I've gotten even more of an education in the 43 years since, from priests, sisters and deacons I've served with, and from parishioners as well. Have there been bad days? It doesn't matter if you are a priest, a lawyer, a farmer, a teacher or an RN: there will be bad days. But I also feel like with God's help I am accomplishing something of great importance. Of course it's with the grace of God, and in teamwork with other priests, staff members and parishioners that I've accomplished anything.
