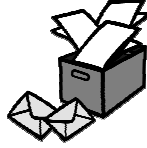

A Note from Fr. Tom

PYREX BOWL: The ladies who cleaned the rectory last week found a white Pyrex, glass bowl with a pale green design of flowers around the outside tucked way in the back of a cupboard. It's a little less than six inches in diameter, and has the initials V.R. written on the bottom with a black felt-tip marker. None of us can figure out who V.R. is. If you are V.R., thank you for whatever you cooked for me, and you may claim your bowl at the rectory.

ASCENSION AND MOTHERS DAY: When we have an early Easter, you get some strange combinations of feasts falling on the same day. I can remember some people being very upset with me the year that Palm Sunday fell on Saint Joseph's Day, and I made no mention of Poland's patron saint. This year's difficult combination is Mothers Day falling on the feast of the Lord's Ascension. People come to church wanting to hear something that praises their mother, but the Church's calendar says no, today we're keeping a much older feast, and one that very much has to do with our salvation. Some of us want to tell the people who make up the calendar, "Don't you think that my mother has a lot to do with my salvation?" Let's see if I can bring the two celebrations together: Jesus ascended to heaven, body and soul, human nature and divine nature. He showed us what our destiny is. We are also destined to be in the presence of God forever, body and soul. By ascending, Jesus showed us that bodies are important. We have bodies so that we may serve God and our brothers and sisters. Our bodies are an essential part of who we are. They don't go on the discard heap when we enter heaven. Just as the whole Christ, soul and body is at the Father's right hand, so to will our bodies be in God's presence.

Jesus ascended according to His Father's plan, but that means that He left His Church down here. The Church consisted of the Apostles and about 120 others, and Mary was among them. (Acts 1:14) Mary had received infinite grace in order to be Mother of God; now she waits in Jerusalem for the grace to be Mother of the Church – our Mother. We're not told how Mary served as Mother of the Church while she was here on earth. The important thing is that she was with the others, waiting to receive a ministry for the rest of the Church. In those ten days of prayer, she showed us that it is important to patiently wait and pray until God shows us what our ministry is for the rest of the community.

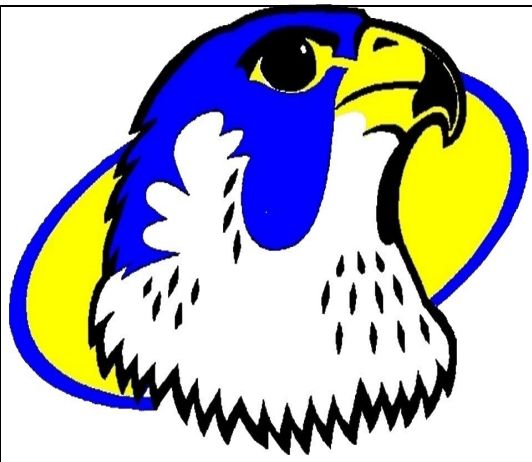

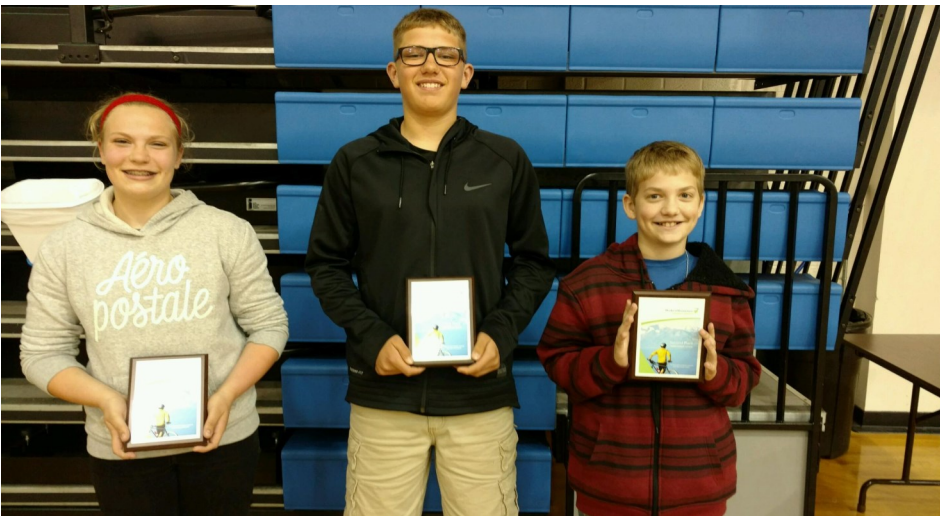
