**MEMORIAL DAY:** The first Memorial Day took place a few years after the Civil War. The day was set aside for the decoration of the graves of soldiers and sailors who had died during the war (hence the older name "Decoration Day.") By our time it has evolved into a commemoration of the dead of all our nation's wars. Because of them we are free to support whatever ideas we want, to worship where we want, to work where we want. Our speech is free and our media are free. Memorial Day is a day to remember that we should take none of this for granted. Freedom isn't free; it has to be defended anew in every generation, sometimes even by men and women in uniform. Freedom also has to be preserved by informed voters who cherish freedom.

Here at St. Anthony, we will celebrate Memorial Day with an 8 a.m. Mass this Monday. The town celebration of Memorial Day will begin with a parade at 10 a.m., beginning at the high school, passing through downtown, and ending at the gazebo in Memorial Park.

**CORPUS CHRISTI:** This Sunday is the feast of Corpus Christi, the celebration of the Body and Blood of the Lord. We focus on just why we do the thing we do every Sunday. At the Last Supper, Jesus said "Do this in memory of me." "Memory" to the Jews did not mean simply a recollection of the past, or a re-enactment. "Memory" meant that when we do the actions, the past event becomes part of our time. When we offer bread and wine, using the words Jesus used at the Last Supper, the sacrifice of the Cross becomes present once again. What greater privilege could we have? What is more deserving of our time and our energy than the Son of God coming among us in our parish church to give us the sacrifice by which we are saved?

**FEAST OF THE SACRED HEART:** This Friday is not only First Friday, with exposition of the Blessed Sacrament from about 8:30 until noon; it's also the Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. It's a day for remembering God's love poured out upon sinners.

**NEW CONFESSION SCHEDULE:** Starting June 7, Confessions will be heard every Tuesday after Mass for about 30 minutes (longer if needed), and on Saturday from 3 to 4. Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament will take place at both these times.

**DON'T FORGET** our parish pilgrimage to Carey for the Holy Year. We will leave our parking lot at about 12:15 pm on Sunday, June 26, There will be time to have a little lunch when we arrive; then we will take part in the outdoor procession at 2:30.
