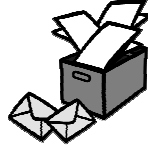

# A Note from Fr. Tom

**NEW CONFESSION SCHEDULE STARTS THIS WEEK:** Confessions will be heard after every Tuesday Mass, starting this week. This Tuesday's Mass is a morning Mass, so the approximate time for Confessions will be 8:30 to 9:00. Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament will take place at the same time.

Saturday Confessions will continue to take place from 3 to 4 p.m. We will likewise have Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament during this hour.

**ADULT SERVERS:** We didn't have quite enough youth servers sign up to serve weekday Masses this summer, so we will be using some adult servers. If you're a woman who wasn't allowed to be a server "back in the day", or if you're a man who never learned his Latin, and you always wanted to serve Mass but couldn't, now is your big chance! Call the rectory and we will set up an opportunity for you to be trained.

And of course we still appreciate our grade-school and high-school servers. In one of his Holy Thursday letters to priests, St. John Paul II reminded priests that young altar servers are the future leaders of parishes. They may be our future priests, but they are almost surely our future readers, CCD teachers, finance committee members, Holy Communion distributors, etc.

**PILGRIMAGE TO CAREY:** *Why are we having a pilgrimage to Carey on June 26?* We are doing this because Pope Francis proclaimed 2016 a Holy Year. He thought that many of us need a renewed sense of God's mercy and how we should live out divine mercy. One of the things Catholics do during Holy Years is to make pilgrimages. A special feature of a Holy Year is the availability of an indulgence.

*What's an indulgence? Didn't those things go out with Martin Luther, or at least with Vatican II?* We don't stress indulgences the way we used to. And we don't attempt to say how much grace God is giving us. But indulgences are still around. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* says "An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain prescribed conditions through the action of the Church, which, as the minister of redemption, dispenses and applies with authority the treasury of the satisfactions of Christ and the saints." (paragraph 1471). With the time I've got coming in Purgatory, I could use some of those!

*How do I gain the Holy Year indulgence?* 1. Be in the state of grace. 2. Have the interior attitude of complete detachment from sin, even venial sin. 3. Go to Confession and Holy Communion within about 20 days of doing the pious work. 4. Pray for the Pope's intentions. He needs our prayer support since he has the burden of the spiritual care of 1.5 billion Catholics. At least an Our Father and Hail Mary are suggested. 5. Make a pious visit to one of the Holy Year places which the local Bishop has designated. You don't have to fly to Rome any more! Spend some time there in Eucharistic adoration, ending with the Our Father, the Creed, and prayer to Mary. 6. Do a work of penance or charity. Either visit the sick or people in some other difficulty, or make a significant donation to a charitable work (Catholic or otherwise), or give up unnecessary consumption (smoking, alcohol, etc.) for one day, and then donate the money saved to the poor.

*What's this "Holy Door?"* The Holy Door symbolizes God's mercy open wide to us. The traditional gesture is to simply walk through the door to acknowledge our need for God's mercy. Yes, Bishop Thomas has designated Our Lady of Consolation as one of our local churches with a Holy Door.

*Where do I sign up?* Fill out the form in today's bulletin and send it in to the parish office.

*When are we going?* We're going on Sunday, June 26, leaving the church parking lot at about 12:15, and returning at about 6:30.

*How much will the bus cost me?* There is no cost for the bus, thanks to a parishioner. Sunday dinner will be available in the shrine cafeteria. There is a wide price range for their menu.
