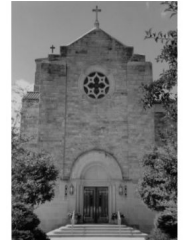



A Note from Fr. Tom

JULIE KING PRAYER SERVICE: At the request of some of Julie’s friends and neighbors, we will hold a prayer service for Julie’s healing this Wednesday, June 15 at 7 p.m. We will pray for healing for Julie and her family, and that God’s will be done. The service will consist of some Gospel readings, a Rosary and Benediction. I’m sure that many of us have other sick people to pray for. For example, our former associate pastor Monsignor Cleo Schmenk, who is now 89 years old, has health issues that are becoming more serious, so much so that he has found it necessary to cancel his annual summer trip to Ohio. Please bring Julie’s intentions, and the intentions of all your sick family members and friends before the Lord on Wednesday evening.

FEAST OF SAINT ANTHONY: The feast of Saint Anthony of Padua is this Monday. We will have Mass at 8:00. A parish breakfast with coffee, juice and rolls will follow in our hall. Saint Anthony was one of the great evangelizers of his day. He taught Old Testament at the University of Padua, and frequently preached to thousands of people in town squares. How did he do that, centuries before the invention of microphones and speakers? He was only 36 when he died, totally worn out by his efforts at preaching the Gospel. Let’s ask him to intercede before God for us, that our parish may continue to be a force for sharing the Gospel today.

CAREY PILGRIMAGE: People from all over the Diocese of Toledo and from other dioceses as well have been making pilgrimages to the shrine of Our Lady of Consolation since 1875. How many millions of people must have gone there to seek Mary’s intercession, asking her to bring their needs before her Son. How many have gone there to join their voices to those of Mary and the saints, praising God for His goodness to them? I’ve never heard of anyone claiming to have seen an apparition at Carey, and I’m not aware that Rome has spoken on any of the cures that have happened there. Yet I’ve seen the objects in the basement church that people left behind after a healing, and I’m sure that some of these events were miraculous. All the prayers that people have brought to the shrine for these many years have made the shrine truly to be holy ground.

Time is getting short to sign up for our parish pilgrimage on Sunday, June 26. We’d like to hear from you by Wednesday, June 22. We will leave by bus from our parking lot at 12:15, and return at about 6:30. The bus is free; you may either bring a picnic lunch or else buy lunch at the Shrine cafeteria.
By the way: have your kids or grandkids ever been to this beautiful, prayerful Catholic place?

PRIESTS’ CONVOCATION: Every two years, the Bishop calls a convocation of priests for continuing education, prayer, fellowship and recreation. It’s happening next week in Huron, from the 20th to the 23rd. It looks like 135 priests will be there. Please pray for our spiritual growth during this time with one another and with the Lord. The keynote speaker is Cardinal Edwin O’Brien, former rector of the American seminary in Rome, former military archbishop for the USA, and former Archbishop of Baltimore. His present position is Cardinal Grand Master of the Knights of the Holy Sepulcher. The Knights have 30,000 members; their mission is to provide for the needs of the Catholic Church in the Holy Land. I’m told that Cardinal O’Brien has a message about the present condition of Christians in the Middle East. We priests will also be spending some time on the Sacrament of Matrimony, and the latest norms on annulments.

The Redemptorist priests from St. Gerard, and the Precious Blood priests from Putnam County will be taking care of ordinary priestly ministry in our area from the 20th to the 23rd. In the event of an emergency, I will return to St. Anthony.
