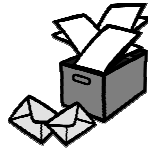

HAPPY FATHERS' DAY! Back in the day, AT&T used to say that Fathers' Day was the busiest day of the year for collect long-distance calls. As he did so many other times, Dad paid the bill. Now that people have cell phones, have we let up on Dad's financial burdens? Seriously now, we should all be grateful to our fathers, living and deceased. They not only paid the bills but also provided the leadership that made us the people we are today. I recently came across a study that said that the father's Mass attendance is the crucial factor in determining whether or not the children will be active Catholics. One of my friends in the priesthood told me he read of another study – a much older one – about children whose fathers died in World War II. The study showed that if the deceased father's picture was in a prominent place in the home, and if the mother frequently mentioned the father's good qualities, his influence would be strong even on children who were too young to remember him. Dad was still Dad even if he had gone to heaven! Thanks Dad, not only for what you do, but also for who you are.
