ONE WEEK LATER... The diocesan priests' biennial gathering happened last week, and so I'm writing this bulletin article on June 16. At these meetings, the Diocese tries to strike a balance between prayer, study and relaxation. I'll let you know how they did.

Speaking of the Diocese, the parishes received a letter from Bishop Thomas about diocesan finances. His letter basically said that they've gone a long way toward curing the deficit they projected for 2016-17. It looked like a \$1.3 million deficit – ouch! Part of the cure was old-fashioned cost containment, cutting things like travel, printing and building service costs. Some of the decisions were much more difficult, as some personnel and programs were let go of (like the *Catholic Chronicle* and Mass for Shut-Ins). They tried not to cause undue disruption to parishes or individuals, but as we all realize, this sort of thing can't be done painlessly. The Bishop and his advisors are trying to be good stewards of our donations to the Annual Catholic Appeal, and are endeavoring to foster the three-fold goal that the Bishop is so fond of mentioning: holy disciples, holy families, and holy vocations.

CROSS CATHOLIC OUTREACH: This Lord's Day we welcome Father John P. Fischer of Cross Catholic Outreach. He will be speaking at all Masses on behalf of the poor in developing countries. This ministry was founded to create a meaningful like between parishes in the U.S.A., and the priests and nuns who work in Caribbean, African, Central American and South American countries. Please be generous in your response to Father's appeal. Brochures are available at all the entrances for those who wish to support this worthy Catholic cause.

ON THE ROAD: Many of us will be on the road this summer, perhaps to a favorite campground or state park, or perhaps even farther to see other parts of the country. Our Gospel readings find Jesus on the road too, a much more somber road, the road to Jerusalem. Jesus is journeying to the Cross, in obedience to His Father. From Jerusalem He will return to His Father, and from Jerusalem the apostles will go forth to the world. In this ten-chapter-long history of "the way," Jesus teaches us the way that leads to God. It's a way of non-retaliation, of taking His word to others, of almsgiving, of repenting, of saying "yes" to God's mercy to sinners, of remaining faithful while we wait for Jesus to come again, and of depending on God rather than ourselves. From now to October 30, our Gospel readings will be set on the Jerusalem road. The road takes us to the Cross, the Resurrection, and to our mission to the world. Our vacation roads are pleasant; Jesus' road is mandatory.
