PARISH PILGRIMAGE: There were only eight of us on the Holy Year pilgrimage to Our Lady of Consolation Shrine in Carey, but it was a great experience. We prayed as a group, prayed individually with Franciscan priests and brothers, and drove through the Shrine Park where the Stations of the Cross are. Some of us braved the heat and walked in the Rosary procession. The hospitality of the Shrine staff was outstanding. St. Anthony's got a special welcome in their parish bulletin, they allowed us to hold our picnic in the air-conditioned cafeteria even though we were not cash customers, and two Franciscans came out to our vehicles to bless us for a safe journey home. I realize that the Sunday after the county fair may not have been the best date for everyone to go to Carey, and I'm open to suggestions about trying this at a different time of year. Of course, it's impossible to find a weekend that works for everybody. And as far as the weather, what can we do except take what the Lord sends us?

THE POPE AND PEOPLE WHO LIVE TOGETHER: Some people expressed a concern that the Pope said that it's ok if people live together without the Sacrament of Matrimony. That's not exactly correct. He said that the Church needs to treat such couples with kindness and respect. He was very harsh on priests who refuse baptism to the babies of such couples (which I understand was a constant problem when he was the Archbishop of Buenos Aires.) And he questioned whether the Church's law should give such couples a "free pass" when they break up, and then want to marry someone new. It is still considered sinful for an unmarried couple to live together as if they were husband and wife, because they are acting as if they were in the life-long, faithful and fruitful relationship of marriage, but are in truth permitting themselves a way out in case one of them no longer wants the other.

THE FOURTH OF JULY: In 1776, John Adams said of the 4th of July: "I am apt to believe that it will be celebrated, by succeeding Generations, as the great anniversary Festival. It ought to be commemorated, as the Day of Deliverance by solemn Acts of Devotion to God Almighty. It ought to be solemnized with Pomp and Parade, with Shows, Games, Sports, Guns, Bells, Bonfires and Illuminations from one End of this Continent to the other from this Time forward forever more." So do all that, and have a picnic too, while you are at it.

The Fourth of July is also a good day to remember that freedom isn't free. Legislatures, governors and presidents of both parties are tempted to nibble away at it. An arrangement "just for the present crisis" has a way of becoming permanent. That's not an endorsement of the Libertarians (who are pro-choice anyway); it's only to say how important it is to be well informed, to communicate with your local, state and national representatives, and to vote. And being well informed doesn't mean watching the news programs that you agree with. It is necessary to get your information from a wide variety of sources.
