R.C.I.A.: In a grade-school classroom back in Toledo, a young man said those initials stood for "Recruiting Catholics in America." Trying hard not to laugh, I said that wasn't quite correct. We don't recruit, and it's not just for America. It happens around the world. R.C.I.A. really stands for "Rite for the Christian Initiation of Adults." It's the process that has taken the place of old-fashioned convert instructions. The old-fashioned way wasn't bad. I got to meet prospective converts one-on-one, I explained the faith to them point by point, and once we were through the textbook, I baptized them.

Nowadays it isn't just Father presenting; a team presents topics concerning our faith. We don't meet one-on-one. We try to give a model of what Christian community is like. We pray together; we discuss together. We have a textbook, and we usually stick with it. But I like to take some other topics at times – for example, an Advent evening of recollection before Christmas. When the inquirers are ready, they are gradually introduced to the congregation on Sunday morning, and we ask for everyone's prayers as they prepare for the sacraments.

We no longer sneak people in the side door of church for a private baptism. Unless there is an excellent reason to do otherwise, we always have Baptism, Confirmation and First Holy Communion at the Easter Vigil (that will be Saturday, April 15, 2017). That's the most important and most dramatic celebration in the Church's calendar. It's an appropriate day for Baptism, because Baptism is really joining ourselves to Jesus in His death, putting aside the old sinful person, and rising from the water to new life in the risen Lord.

When will RCIA start? It will start sometime after Labor Day, on a day and at a time that fits the inquirers' schedules. Many of us know someone who should be invited to join the Catholic Church; there are people out there who are waiting to be asked. Please consider bringing someone you know who is interested. There is no immediate obligation. If a person chooses to postpone the sacraments, or to go in a totally different direction, I am not upset. I figure any time we've spent talking about the Lord, His holy Word, and His Church is never wasted time. I'm looking forward to hearing from parishioners who have invited an adult or teen to join St. Anthony.
