A Note from Fr. Tom

FESTIVAL NEWS: It's only one week away! It's a lot of fun for everyone, even the workers. All of us are important to the success of the festival, each in our own way. Every worker counts; all of us contribute something to the success of this event that provides a major share of the year's income. I have just a very few requests for help:

- We need more volunteers for the French Fry booth on Saturday evening.
- We ask that parents look over the worker list, and notice where their sons' and daughters' jobs are. Please make sure they are present. We are counting on them.
- On Monday morning at about 8:00 a.m., we will start dismantling everything and putting it away for the 2017 festival. For the last several years a great work crew has turned out. One year we finished before lunch! So you see that clean-up is not a huge time commitment, but it's necessary.

TODAY'S GOSPEL and the FESTIVAL: An interviewer once asked J. Paul Getty, who may then have been the richest man in the United States, why he still drove a beat-up old car. He said, "If you think wealthy people want to get more money so they can buy more things, you haven't understood at all. People who don't have money want money to be able to spend it. Really rich people want more money just to have it. Some people collect butterflies or stamps; rich people collect money. To have it." But in today's Gospel, Jesus is telling us that the important thing is not the size of a person's (or parish's) bank account; what is important is the size of the heart.

I hope we do well financially at the festival. Don't we all? However, we aren't making money in order to have money. We're making money in order to have the tools we need for spreading the Gospel.
