THE FESTIVAL IS HERE! It's the weekend we've all been anticipating: the dinner, the country store, the bingo prizes, the 5K race, the renewal of friendships, the hamburgers with accompanying beverages, the rides, the excitement of the big drawings, and all the rest. It takes so much hard work to put on our festival, and I am so very grateful. Let's all be supportive to one another; there's no such thing as "that's not my job." And please remember the clean-up on Monday morning. The festival is not really over until everything is put away in good order for the 2017 festival. Thanks to everybody who worked on Thursday and Friday, and to those who will work.

LOCKING THE CHURCH: It has been a long-time tradition at St. Anthony to keep the church open 24/7 for anyone who wants to stop in and pray. That tradition came to an end last Sunday morning when we found that the flat-screen TV was pulled off the wall, 14 pounds of hot dogs were missing, food for the July 31 bridal shower was eaten by uninvited guests, and that an attempt had been made to break into the Knights of Columbus room. The loss is covered by the Diocese of Toledo self-protected insurance plan (minus the \$500 deductible), but that's not the point. The point is that our society has changed, and not for the better. Churches used to be sacred, even to the criminal element. Rural areas and small towns used to be no-crime zones. But in this day of youths who have no parental guidance, and people who need to fuel their drug habit, a church is just one target among many. Other parishes have experienced much worse crimes. Vandals emptied all the fire extinguishers in Transfiguration of the Lord Parish in Upper Sandusky, covering everything with fine powder. Things were bad enough that they had to celebrate their First Communion Mass in the gym. And the clean-up was very expensive. Lots of volunteers turned out to hold the cost down, but some things like the HVAC system and the pipe organ had to be cleaned professionally. Several years before that, the Blessed Sacrament was desecrated at St. Francis Xavier in Willard, which to my mind would be the ultimate horror.

Columbus Grove probably faces the same problems as those two towns. We need to be good stewards of God's house, or thieves may conclude that the upstairs of our church is as handy a target as the downstairs. With help from Leever Glass Co. in Defiance, the manufacturer of our doors, we are now able to lock and unlock all the doors using just one key.

The policy will be this: Staff members and frequent volunteers will be supplied with keys. A key will be loaned to anyone who needs temporary access to the hall. If any parishioner is in the habit of praying in church at night, we will be happy to make them the long-term loan of a key. The church will be locked every night after the last evening event, and unlocked at about 6:30 a.m. This policy may be adjusted when we have had more experience with it.

DONATIONS NEEDED: We have used up all donations that parishioners gave to help us help people in emergencies. The Guardian Angel Fund, which gives tuition assistance to families who may not be able to pay their children's tuition, will be very low after we help families who have indicated a need for this school year. I will make a further report on these needs later on in August.
