

This meeting is required for all potential candidates and their spouses. The theology of the diaconate and the process of formation will be presented. ASSUMPTION OF MARY: This Monday, August 15 is the feast of the Assumption of Mary. This feast is important for two reasons: 1. Mary's being taken into heaven body and soul is a sign of her importance as Mother of God; 2. The Assumption of Mary shows us the destiny that God has planned for every human being. We will celebrate this mystery of our faith on Monday at 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. The evening Mass time is changed so as not to interfere with the school's open house.

FESTIVAL THANKS: How could I ever say enough thanks to enough people? We had excellent weather; the heat and humidity became less brutal for just the right 48 hours. So many people worked very hard and kept their cool about it, and all of our visitors seemed to be very happy. The booth chairmen to whom I have talked say that they had more customers than in 2016. We also received some significant donations to hold down the cost. So I am very hopeful about this year's festival profit.

LOTTERY TREE: One of the incoming fifth-grade girls pulled my name out of the hopper, and I won the Lottery Tree. It's a Colorado blue spruce, now planted in the rectory side yard. It had been decorated with 100 Ohio Lotto tickets. I looked at that stack of lottery tickets, and dreamed up big plans for my Trump-like wealth. Every kid would get a scholarship; the church would get the marble wainscoting that we never were able to afford; the Bishop's financial problems would go away, et cetera. And then I scratched off all 100 tickets. Sorry, everybody, but I won just enough money to have a good time with at the 2017 festival.

EXPOSITION, CONFESSIONS, BENEDICTION: The expanded Confession schedule has been working well (exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, after Mass every Tuesday, Confessions for 30 minutes or until all are heard, Benediction). Now I'm able to serve some people whom I hadn't served before. An unexpected result is an increase in Saturday Confessions. The only small glitch is that it doesn't work to have Exposition on a Saturday when there is a wedding. People socialize in church after weddings, and it takes a while for the photographer to get his pictures. But we will have Exposition and Benediction on Saturdays when there is no wedding. So even if you haven't planned to confess, come to church for a Holy Hour, or even a Holy Ten Minutes on Tuesday or Saturday.

GUARDIAN ANGEL FUND: Due to some recent generous donations, the Guardian Angel Fund stands at about \$11,500. This is more than enough to take care of families who have requested help to keep their children in Saint Anthony School. Any additional donations will be used to help with tuition for families that might have an emergency later in the year. Usually I do not give people a "full free ride." I believe that for most families, it is better if they make an investment in their child's education. I ask them how much they can afford to give once a month for ten months, and then the Guardian Angel Fund tries to pick up the balance – which we are able to do this fall, thanks to your generosity.

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL FUND: Our fund for helping the needy is overdrawn. Several years ago, parishioners gave \$2797 to help the poor of this area. We set up some rules: 1. We would help people who have a Columbus Grove, Pandora or Vaughnsville address; 2. we would help parishioners no matter where they live; 3. we would give consideration to helping out-of-town people stranded in Columbus Grove; 4. gasoline help would be restricted to \$25 once every 3 months; 5. we would help with utility bills, but we would expect the individual to apply for help at other agencies, like the Salvation Army or Putnam County Job and Family Services; 6. if we gave a large amount of help, we would not be able to help again for six months. Following these rules, we have helped as follows: gasoline, \$793.48; electricity, 1312.41; heating, 50.00; water, 354.32; medical expenses, 371.38; car repairs 166.88; and funeral lunch expense, 45.75. These add up to \$3094.22. We no longer pay for car repairs, because we found that this was being abused. We were surprised to learn that none of the social service agencies will help with a water bill. We are grateful to Tabler's for helping us monitor gasoline purchases for people in need, and for allowing us to put these amounts on the parish's monthly bill.
