COLLECTION FOR FLOOD VICTIMS: On the weekend of September 17-18, all the dioceses of the United States will be taking up a collection for victims of the floods in Louisiana. It is estimated that 140,000 people were left homeless. We will send your offering to Catholic Charities of Toledo, who will then forward <u>all</u> money to Catholic Charities of the dioceses in Louisiana that are affected. We received help from other dioceses when we had floods in Wyandot, Hancock and Putnam Counties – even from some of the poorest dioceses in the United States. Now in this Year of Mercy it's our turn to help.

COLLECTION FOR THE FOREIGN MISSIONS: The annual collection for the foreign missions (Society for the Propagation of the Faith) will take place this fall. (I'm negotiating on the date, since I don't want it to be too close to the collection for flood victims.)

THAT MAN IS YOU begins the fall semester of Year 2 this Saturday. Breakfast is served at 6 a.m.; we will show a video at 6:30 a.m.; have a discussion at 7:00 a.m.; and have a closing prayer and be on our way at 7:30 a.m. I found Year One very helpful for my ministry and prayer life. I feel sure that the other 40 men who took part felt the same. If you didn't take part in Year 1, you are still welcome to come to Year 2. Year 2's topics do not build on Year 1. However, if you are interested, we can give you a web-link that will enable you to view Year 1 on your own.

ST. ANDREW DINNER: Several times a year, the Diocese hosts a dinner with the Bishop for young men who want to know more about priesthood. High-school juniors through men 40 years old are welcome. One of these dinners will take place in our parish hall on Tuesday, October 18. The agenda is prayer, a good dinner, and personal witness talks by the Bishop and a few others. We depend on God's grace for success, but God's grace works through parents and grandparents, the local priest, the youth minister, and through all the parishioners. I'm going to invite some of our young men, but since I can't think of everybody who should be asked, I would ask you to do some inviting too.

PILGRIM VIRGIN: The 100th anniversary of the apparition of Mary to the three young children at Fatima is coming up soon. As part of the centennial, there will be Pilgrim Virgin statues touring the United States beginning this fall. Toledo is one of the first dioceses where this will happen. The Pilgrim Virgin statue of Our Lady of Fatima will be at Saint Anthony on Wednesday, October 19. The plan is to have Rosary devotions every hour on the hour, beginning after Mass and concluding at 7 p.m. I am going to ask our parish and school organizations to help with these devotions.

LABOR DAY: Labor Day means that summer is rounding third base and heading home. One of these days we'll certainly feel fall in the air. For many parishioners, that's when the real labor will start as they harvest their crops and haul them to the elevator. The Church invites us to take a broader look at human labor than simply the work that we must do to support our families. Pope Francis says that human dignity comes from having work by which someone can support himself and his family. He also has upheld the plight of young people who cannot find work, and of people who struggle to make ends meet by working two or more part-time jobs, and suggested that many migrants flee their own countries because there is no work for them. He has also said that we need to safeguard the environment rather than exploit it, because the environment will provide jobs for future workers. He talked about the danger of "the globalization of indifference," that is to say, that we stand back, look at these problems and somehow regard them as just the normal state of affairs. That is a reaction we must absolutely refuse and react against. The Church's concern – our concern – must be for the dignity of work around the world.
